- Brad of the Red Dome is once again booked to provide the BBQ for the AT Banquet


New Business

Solving a Starter Problem

The other day I took a neighbor for a ride in the Model A. We went to Del Amo shopping center, drove around for a half-hour, stopping and shutting off the car several times. Got home and parked the car in the driveway as usual. At 4 p.m. I went out to put the car in the garage and I heard the starter spin but the motor wouldn't turn over! After a few more tries, I decided something must be wrong with the starter. So, I took out my tools and proceeded to remove the starter.

First thing, disconnect the battery! A few bolts here, a screw or two there, and the starter was out. Over to the work bench, looking it over I noticed one of the ears that hold the drive spring broke off, and therefore the drive gear would not engage the flywheel. As luck would have it, I had a new (modern) drive gear assembly. It's all encased in a big housing.

Well, it was very easy to install it on the starter shaft. I went to reinstall the starter and it WOULDN'T FIT back into the flywheel housing!! The starter was hitting the engine block water inlet elbow! I had to drain the water, remove the elbow, and now the starter had enough room to maneuver this modern bulkier starter drive over the flywheel. I reassembled everything back together and the engine starts great.



I read somewhere these modern drives are very reliable, we'll see! I would suggest carrying a spare starter drive spring about \$8, or the whole assembly for \$25, or the modern one for \$40 in your tool box of parts for peace of mind while driving around! Remember, these parts are over 90 years old!!!

Big Boy Locomotive



Big Boy No. 4014 is scheduled for a whistle stop in Big Sandy at 1:00 pm on September 17, 2024 as part of its "Heartland of America Tour." You may remember that Ken Parker got up close and personal with Big Boy No. 4014 back in September of 2021 when it made a stop in Jefferson. Ken came away thoroughly impressed.

The locomotive's 2024 tour began at its home in Cheyenne, Wyoming on August 28, and wend its way through Nebraska, Iowa, Illinois, Missouri and Arkansas, and is scheduled to reach Texas on September 17. The Texas portion of its 2024 tour will begin in Texarkana and eventually join Highway 80 as it makes its way to Dallas for an overnight stop. The behemoth will then continue down to Houston, where it will double-back north with a stop in Fort Worth, and continue on through Oklahoma, Kansas, and Colorado until it reaches back home in Cheyenne. Big Sandy is the locomotive's first stop on the Texas part of its tour.

Twenty-five Big Boys were built exclusively for Union Pacific Railroad, the first of which was delivered in 1941. The locomotives were 132 feet long and weighed 1.2 million pounds. The massive engines normally operated between Ogden, Utah, and Cheyenne.

Big Boy No. 4014 was delivered to Union Pacific in December, 1941. The locomotive was retired in December 1961, having traveled 1,031,205 miles in its 20 years in service. Union Pacific reacquired no. 4014 from the RailGiants Museum in Pomona, California, in 2013 and relocated it back to Cheyenne to begin a multi-year restoration process. It returned to service in May 2019 to celebrate the 150th Anniversary of the transcontinental Railroad's completion.


"Gorilla tape! Strapping tape!" Together they wound the sticky tape around the defective hose. Next came the flat strapping.
