As a church we are doing what we can but until all legal issues are addressed, we are limited as to what we can do.
- Stacy Packer is slowly recovering from lung surgery back in October and returning for worship service when she has a good day. She remains under doctor’s care as they monitor her progress. We pray she remains in remission.
- Roy Stephenson mitral valve leakage has decreased. The doctor plans to schedule him for an aorta ring placement if he remains stable. The procedure is experimental and the doctor is waiting on FDA approval. January 13th, he had to have surgery on his right foot again. Hopefully he can bounce back quickly.

You or family member or friend may not be on this list; but, we are all in need of prayer. The pandemic, flu season and the uncertainty in the economy and government shut-down has taken and continues to take its toll on many. Depression, homicides, suicides and gun violence are increasing as well as the impact of climate changes. Take time to check on your neighbors!

REACH of Cherokee and Graham County, Inc. is an outreach program for victims of domestic violence.

As the staff travel to the schools to discuss domestic violence, they have identified a need for children's shoes, underwear, and socks of varying sizes. They have also adopted some families to help as well. **Teens frequently request a fleece blanket.** If you have items of clothing (clean and in good condition), children's books, etc. to donate please place them in the blue bin located in the pantry or you can drop them off to be sorted for the thrift store. Check out the clearance section at Walmart next time you go shopping.

Clients in the safe house can always use travel size shampoo and conditioner, toothbrushes, tooth paste, travel size deodorant, hand sanitizer, etc.

Please contact the REACH office staff if you have furniture you want to donate to arrange pickup by the Thrift Store volunteers. They also ask for cooking utensils to help victims start over. Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back, so they are given clothes, furniture, and items for the home from the Thrift Store until they can get back on their feet. They also can use items to help with their self-esteem and pass the time until they can be placed in a safe environment. You can provide puzzles (500 pieces or less), adult coloring books, reading material, word puzzles, make -up, nail polish, hair clips, etc.

837-2097 or 828-837-8064 for more information. Local REACH covers Cherokee and Graham County.

REACH is leading our community in eliminating domestic violence and sexual assault through education, advocacy, self-empowerment, and community awareness. Suicides statistics among teens and young adults is increasing.

FOOD BANK DONATIONS

We need your help to keep our pantry stocked. If no family, or individual has made a special request; Lula pulls items off the shelves and takes them to the Cherokee-Graham County Food Bank, Inc. in Andrews, NC. The food bank is open to the public on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 10-12.

Other suggested items based on Lula's discussion with some of the female staff: feminine hygiene products and other personal hygiene items, e.g. toothpaste, toothbrushes, bars of soap, wipes, small bottles of shampoo, soups that can be heated over a small fire, small jars of peanut butter and items that do not require a stove for cooking. **Most of their clients are homeless and/or senior citizens living on a fixed income, so they can use small bottles of laundry detergent and Clorox to wash their clothes.** The food bank has a bakery that donates bread, and the local Walmart provides fresh produce.

You can also write a check payable to the Andrews Food Bank, P. O. Box 843, Andrews, NC 28901, and they will supplement items that are not being donated.

Let Christ Be Our Guide

On the old television show "Hee Haw," Doc Campbell was confronted by a patient who said he broke his arm in two places. The doc replied, "Well then, stay out of them places!" Many times, in our lives we make the decision to refrain or refuse things we know are not the best choice for us to make. It starts out with smaller choices that so many people would say are trivial. "Will it hurt me to watch one "R" rated movie? Will it be a big deal if I take one or two drinks on occasion? What is wrong with a little immorality in my life?" When we take a proper stand on the smaller choices, the right decisions we need to make about the bigger ones become easier.

There are choices to be made and sometimes those choices will have to include our refusal to accept certain things as part of our lives. There comes a time when we need to eliminate some of the multitude of "good" things and make way for the great things God wants to do through us. Are all the good things in life all that good for us?

We are blessed people because

we have a multitude of wisdom made available to us in one written book, the Bible, but that is not the only source of wisdom we possess. We also have many examples of what happens to people who make foolish choices, and we have the memory of the foolish mistakes we have made. Have you ever done anything you now consider to be stupid, and you know you will never do again? If you lived up north, did you ever stick your tongue to a frozen piece of metal? I never have because I saw other stupid people who did it.

So, how can I make wise choices? I found two sources of information on this. One is from the book *The Pursuit of Holiness* by Jerry Bridges. He offers some questions we can ask ourselves when we need to discern the difference between a good choice and a bad choice. The second resource comes from Charles Stanley and his *In Touch Ministry*. Some of the questions are similar or overlap, so I will combine the two. 1. Is it helpful physically, spiritually, or mentally? 2. Will it control me? 3. Will it hurt or help anybody else? 4. Will it help me accomplish my goals in life? 5. Will it be wise stewardship of my time and resources? 6. Will it fit into God's Biblical teaching? 7. Will it glorify God?
