Course Description

Human trafficking is a modern-day form of slavery. Human trafficked sex or labor victims (including children) are forced by persuasion, threat or violence into activities they cannot leave and did not choose. Victims are frequently seen by some member of a healthcare team 7 times before any notice or possible identification of symptoms is made.

Designed for healthcare professionals, this course meets the criteria for most medical licensing in Michigan.

Target Audience

All healthcare professionals: physicians, podiatrists, pharmacists, dentists, PAs, nurses, NPs, social workers, therapists (OT/PT, etc.). Faculty, residents and students in the health professions are encouraged to attend.
