



Tavit Tashjian, Piano




Armenian-American pianist Tavit Tashjian was born in Nicosia, Cyprus. He began his first piano lessons when he was six years old, discovering very early that his desire was to become a concert pianist. His primary mentors and teachers have included film composer/pianist Marcelo Cesena, Alexander Toradze, Professor of the internationally renowned Toradze Piano Studio at Indiana University, and primarily Dr. Caio Pagano at Arizona State University.

He has performed throughout North America and Europe and has been featured with the Mississippi Symphony, Roanoke Symphony and Lima Symphony, and has recently recorded an album with British violinist Pip Clarke. Currently he serves as Director of Music at First Christian Church and maintains a studio of private students. In 2018 he began the Keys to the Classics concert series to spread the art of classical music to the community.

Kristi Hanno, Clarinet

Clarinetist Kristi Hanno, a native Iowan currently based in Phoenix as a teaching artist, has performed for communities across the United States and throughout Europe in Belgium, France, Germany, Spain, Iceland and Croatia, as both a soloist and a chamber musician. Discussing and workshopping various topics concerning the clarinet, chamber music, sustainability, interdisciplinary and sociological aspects are what Ms. Hanno enjoys sharing in masterclass and recital settings. Ms. Hanno strives to shatter any traditional assumptions toward what it means to be a musician today.

Argentinean cellist Luciana Gallo is an avid performer currently based in Reno, Nevada. Her international career has taken her to perform in Argentina, Canada, Brazil and Switzerland. She plays with the Reno Philharmonic Orchestra and the Tucson Symphony Orchestra. As a chamber musician, Dr. Gallo frequently collaborates with various artists, including Tavit Tajshian, and she is a member of the Oracle Piano Quartet. Dr. Gallo recently graduated with a doctorate in Cello Performance from Arizona State University, where she was a teaching assistant to Thomas Landschoot. In addition, Dr. Gallo is a third generation Pilates instructor specializing in Pilates for Musicians, and teaches a class for the musicians of the Tucson Symphony Orchestra. Dr. Gallo completed an apprenticeship with Katrina Foe and is fully certified both by Balanced Body and by Pilates Sports Center.

talk about The Financial Crisis of 2008: Where was the Federal Reserve and Could It Happen Again?

Arthur J. Rolnick is a Senior Fellow at the Humphrey School of Public Affairs at the University of Minnesota and an adjunct professor in the Department of Economics there. He has also been a visiting professor of economics at Boston College, the University of Chicago and Lingnan College in Guangzhou, China. Art previously served at the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis as a senior vice president and director of research, as well as an associate economist with the Federal Open Market Committee - the monetary policymaking body for the Federal Reserve System. He is currently working to advance multidisciplinary research on child development and social policy.




