Neighborhood Issues, Code Violations 311 App & Resident Involvement

- Coronado Hills & Berkman Property:
 - Update: Partial demolition permits approved (plumbing & electrical included).
 - Shelby contacted the property owners regarding fire prevention and expected construction timelines but has not obtained any additional information from owners.
- Glen Hill Property (Back of the Neighborhood):
 - Court Case Update:
 - Owner did not attend the Feb 12 hearing, leading to a code violation fine.
 - Courtney Britt (Code Officer) provided updates and assistance.
 - Call to Action:
 - Neighbors should continue reporting concerns via 311 (app and phone number) to strengthen the case
 - The 311 app and calling 311 was featured in the newsletter as a tool for reporting neighborhood issues. Links to mobile app below

Amplify Austin Day – March 5-6, 2025

- Promoting Local Nonprofits:
 - Tree Folks and SoCo Women's Chorus were highlighted.
 - Residents encouraged to suggest additional organizations for promotion via email, newsletter, or Facebook

Request for Guest Speakers and Topics for Future Meetings

- Past topics have included Austin PD, code enforcement, and recycling programs.
- Residents invited to suggest guest speakers for future meetings.
- Neighbor requested discussing a code enforcement update on Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) and zoning changes

Bulk Pickup System Concerns

- Changes to Bulk Pickup in Austin:
 - Now appointment-based instead of a scheduled city-wide collection.
 - Concerns raised about potential perpetual junk piles throughout the neighborhood.
 - Neighbor proposal to invite a city representative to explain the new process
- Proposed Solutions:
 - Coordinating bulk pickups among neighbors to minimize aesthetic issues.
 - Using Buy Nothing Groups for items that can be repurposed

Fence Repair at Glen Hill

- Issue: The fence near Glen Hill, the fire station, and Section 8 housing has been repeatedly taken down.
- Community-Led Solution:
 - Neighborhoods volunteered to repair the fence using donated materials.
 - Madison (Treasurer) suggested posting in the Buy Nothing Group to request supplies.
- Board Action: Shelby (President) will coordinate via email to organize materials and volunteers

Sidewalk Repairs & Shared Streets Program


Sidewalk Repairs Needed:

- Reports of uneven sidewalks creating tripping hazards.
- Residents advised to report issues via 311.
- Shared Streets Project:

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- Coronado Hills is designated as a "Shared Streets" neighborhood, meaning pedestrians and vehicles share roadways instead of having designated sidewalks throughout the area
- City updates Shared street program should include sidewalk repairs and new ADA-compliant ramps along Coronado Hills

Walk, Talk, & Tidy Initiative

- Last event: February 16, 2025.
 - Cleaned Northeast High School parking lot & Coronado Hills/Berkman area.
 - Photos for previous event were posted on Facebook group
- Next event:
 - Likely after the next general meeting (Sundays preferred).

 Neighbor recommended monitoring 290 & Creekside as key dumping areas

Additional Neighborhood Concerns

- A person experiencing homelessness appears to have moved from Glen Hill & Berkman to a new location near Berkman & Coronado Hills. Concerns shared for impact on neighborhood perception, as people judge the neighborhood based on entry points rather than individual homes.
- Residents are encouraged to submit reports to 311 regularly to increase urgency with the city.

- Cold front moving through the area, with temperatures expected to drop significantly over the next 24 hours.
- Protect Plants, Pipes, and Pets (The "Three P's")
