



THE FEAST OF SAINT **STEPHEN**

December 26

Curiously, the day after Christmas is the Feast of St. Stephen who was the first martyr. Perhaps the church wishes to remind us that while the joy of Christmas is with

us always, the day after Christmas we need to get back to the work of our regular lives. In the case of Stephen he died as Jesus did: falsely accused, brought to unjust condemnation because he spoke the truth fearlessly. He was ceased by the Sanhedrin for his testimony to the faith and stoned to death. He died with his eyes trustfully fixed on God, and with a prayer of forgiveness on his lips. A "happy" death is one that finds us in the same spirit, whether our dying is as quiet as St. Joseph's or as violent as Stephen's: dying with courage, total trust and forgiving love.


