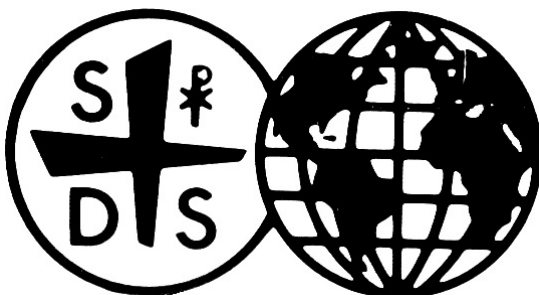
Has this transition been easy?

From Haiti



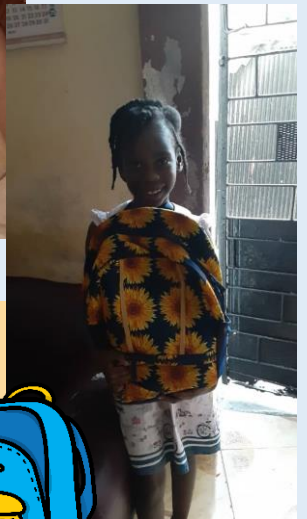

“So many have benefited from your donations. Thank you very much for helping me to help those who have less. God bless you all and receive help so that many poor people can be benefited.”

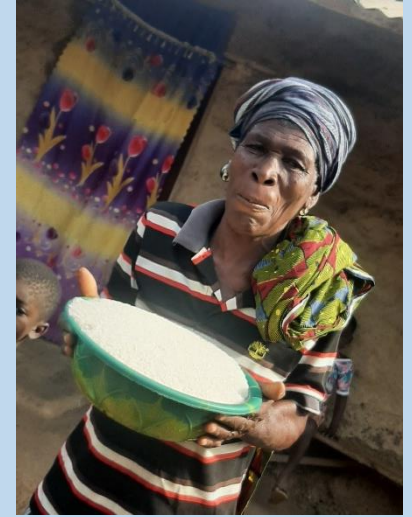
