



In Memoriam



The Frugal Collector, Vol. I

Bob Jones. 2011. Ventura, CA: J Miller Media/Miller Magazines, Inc. 255 pgs. With knowledge and experience, collectors on a limited budget can still develop an interesting and educational mineral collection. Each of the 16 chapters originated as a feature article in Rock & Gem Magazine. A mineral collector since WW II, Bob has enlarged on each subject. Stunning color photos throughout.
