A Qualified WIN for our Neighborhood Plan



On June 11, 2015, Austin City Council voted to indefinitely postpone an applicant

request to rezone and change our Neighborhood Plan zoning for a plot of land near 183/290 highways. Hundreds of us spent over three years carefully planning our future land use for our neighborhood, then voting to oppose the rezoning at numerous meetings beginning 2014 through 2015.

It is gratifying to see that we have a say in protecting the integrity of our plan.

The proposed amendment would have allowed housing units in an extremely dangerous intersection, living with noise, highway pollution, and unsafe entry and exit from the properties among many other problems.

Our urban core neighborhoods are under attack by developers eager to make money at the expense of neighborhoods—teardowns of existing houses to build monstrosities, investors buying properties to warehouse vulnerable adults, or use as short-term rentals. This leaves neighborhoods permanently damaged. This is OUR neighborhood!

Let's be vigilant in protecting our lovely neighborhood and our property investments for ourselves and future Coronado residents.
