



## Something Old ....

Gone are the 10 old wood lighting poles that seem to always be between your line of sight and the playing field.

Gone are the dangerous 13,200 volts of overhead wiring.

Gone are the old incandescent fixtures that only produced about 8 footcandle power on the playing field.

## Something New . . . .

Six new 100-foot steel poles set behind the bleechers, to provide an unobstructed view of the playing field.

New underground wiring, eliminating the danger of overhead wiring,

#### Facts about new lighting...

Twenty-one Metal Halite 1,000-watt fixtures and one incandescent light per pole.

126,000 total watts produce 50 candlefoot power on the playing field-enough for television cameras.

Each pole will withstand winds in excess of 100 miles per hour.


The base of each pole measures 12' x 12' x 9'; contains 50 yards of concrete and 6 anchor bolts, each measuring 2" in diameter and 8' long.


