#### The Reverend's Ruminations - May 2025

It seems hard to believe that the long, reflective, journey of Lent is now in our past. Even the excitement and joy of Easter morning — slightly drizzly, yet mild as it was this year — may seem to have come and gone. But they are not. Easter may be just a long weekend on the calendar to some, who see only an opportunity to hide little plastic eggs, gorge on chocolate, or get together for a fancy meal with family. But you and I didn't come to church just to show off a brightly-colored tie, a frilly new dress, or our finest Easter bonnet; we came to remember (or be jarred into recognition of) Jesus present in our own lives.

Sometimes we take it for granted, and forget what an incredible sacrifice Christ made for us. Sometimes bread is just a dietary staple. Sometimes grape juice is just a refreshing drink filled with healthy antioxidants. But when we gather around Holy Communion as we did on Maudy Thursday and Easter Sunday, these same elements that we might take for granted in our refrigerator become a sacrament that unites us with fellow believers here in our own congregation, around the world, and — most importantly — with our risen Savior.

When we experience Jesus during special seasons like Christmas, Lent, or Easter, our senses become awakened to experience even our surroundings in a whole new way. Similar to Mary's experience outside the tomb, we are awakened to the physical, emotional, and communal experience of Jesus in our midst — through the taste of the communion elements, the familiar scent of the sanctuary, the stirring melody of a favorite hymn, the feel of the Bible on your lap, and the wooden pew at your back. I pray that the Easter morning story of Christ's resurrection would never cease to be the bedrock of your faith. May it be a faith you are willing and eager to share with others!

Yes, I realize that even the original apostles struggled, finding the women's excited proclamation of the empty tomb that first Easter morning "[like] an idle tale, and they did not believe them" (Luke 24:11). Our challenge now, like that of Peter and the apostles, is not only to remember Jesus' resurrection, but to continue believing and applying its joy in our lives. Sitting in fuller-than-normal pews on Easter Sunday, it was easy to believe in and affirm Jesus' resurrection with a rare UCC "Amen." But what about when someone lets you down, or a friend or loved one suddenly dies, or something you gave up during Lent seems now to be even more tempting than before? Will Easter then be just a distant memory? I hope that you are always ready to boldly proclaim, "He is risen," and then articulate what that means for your Christian faith journey.

Here in our sanctuary, it's encouraging to see some new faces from time to time. Sure, sometimes they are just visiting relatives, whether for Easter or a special event like graduation, but other times a visitor may come church shopping or just be visiting in town. I hope that no matter the occasion, you have taken an opportunity to make them feel welcome. As followers of the Risen Christ, we have two basic calls in our Christian life. The "great commission" (to go and make disciples of all the nations, as referenced in Matthew 28) calls us to be fishermen — a job some of you might love doing on the lake, but which can feel a little awkward the first time it's done for people. Fear not, if a bunch of real-life fishermen and laborers could do it in Palestine, then any of us can do it too!

As I glanced back at some previous newsletters, I came across May of 2020, and can hardly believe that only five short years ago we were weeks from what we hoped would be the end of the state's extended *Stay Home MN* order. After several months of restrictions on group gatherings and careful social distancing, the tide of new COVID-19 infections in Minnesota finally seemed to be turning. Online worship services and *Zoom* council / board meetings had become a "new normal" for us by that time — something none of us are eager to repeat!?! I concluded my May 2020 "Rumination" by saying, "Though we haven't been able to gather in person, I continue to hold each of you in my prayers. We are working our way through this together, and I am confident that we will emerge as an even stronger congregation than when we began!" I hope you agree that we have indeed emerged stronger only a few short years after that struggle, as evidenced by our 2025 congregational theme: **Our Church is a Family, and We Are Stronger Together!**





The Council met in Heritage Hall at 5:45 PM. Moderator Kay Campe called the meeting to order, and Pastor Cory led in prayer.

Motion to approve the minutes from the meeting on 3/19/25 was M/S/C. (Amanda Forstrom/ Larry Lasch)

**Treasurer's Report** Catherine Johnson reported that online giving is going well with a little over \$11,000 donated online this year. Linsey Preuss, our Edward Jones financial advisor, will speak about our investments. A motion to receive the treasurer's report was M/S/C. (Larry Lasch/Sue Kruse)

**OLD BUSINESS:** Upcoming fundraisers were discussed. For Interlaken Heritage Days, June 14, we will have a breakfast outside, pie & ice cream social (prices stay the same) and activities on the front lawn during the parade (lawn games & freeze pops). Imagine Martin is having pig races on May 24. We will have bacon desserts from 5:00-7:00 PM that night.

**NEW BUSINESS:** We discussed the Situational Support Review from the MN Conference.

**INVESTMENT REVIEW:** Linsey Preuss, our Edward Jones financial advisor, said that we have three funds invested with them: Cornerstone, General and Capital. The present volatile market outlook and our thoughts for future investment were discussed.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Cory reported on his activities and upcoming commitments.

#### **BOARD REPORTS:**

**Christian Education:** No representative. The May 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday Funday will be used to make Mother's and Father's Day gifts. There is a celebration of our graduates on May 11th. The last day of Sunday school and an all-church bowling party is on May18th.

**Hospitality:** Tara Thedens stated that the board is serving lemonade/coffee and cake for the graduate celebration. They purchased a hand mixer for the kitchen and are planning to purchase a roaster and possibly a pasta pot and new pots/pans. They have been making plans for the pie & ice cream social. There will be signup lists for ingredient donations and help with baking and serving soon.

**Facilities:** Larry Lasch reported that three carbon monoxide detectors have been installed, one for each level of the church. They have been reviewing vendor's contracts from this year. Snow removal and lawn care costs will stay the same. Cleaning services will increase by 50 cents/hour. The hole in the alley was discussed. A motion was made that the area right next to the church will be a no-parking zone was M/S/C. (Catherine Johnson/Sue Kruse) Hopefully, this will give cars extra space to drive around the hole.

**Diaconate:** Sue Kruse did not have an update more than their minutes stated.

**Mission:** Amanda Forstrom said that the May blessing box will go towards our youth campers. Signups for Meals on Wheels (May 1-15) and the highway cleanup (May 3) are in the back of the church. Discussed if we still want to do future highway cleanups and how to involve more people.

**Worship:** Cindy Huset reported that they served over 129 meals at the community meal in March. They would like to suggest that takeout orders are only available after possibly 6:00 PM to speed up the line.

**OTHER:** Catherine Johnson, Kay Campe, Pastor Cory, and Christina Hainy met to discuss and explore our online program ChurchTrac regarding a church directory.

Moderator Kay Campe adjourned the meeting, and Pastor Cory closed in prayer.

#### Hy-Vee & Fareway Report as of Report as of 20 April 2025

During the last 9 weeks, \$17,417.26 (8.71%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 19 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$87,714.42 (43.86%) toward the 18<sup>th</sup> goal which is \$200,000.

During the same time, \$7,768.35 (5.18%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 108 weeks, Fareway is at \$120,407.24 (80.27%) toward our  $5^{th}$  \$150,000 goal. It could take 30 weeks to reach the  $5^{th}$  \$150,000 goal.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Slips from 2019 were received during this period of time. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Slips from Hy-Vee Fast & Fresh (Gas), Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Delivery slips/sheets can also be used. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the church, or mailing them or dropping them off at my house. Even the very small amounts help.


CONGRATULATIONS GRADUATES!


