

Many of you are probably aware that 2018 was the wettest year on record in Louisville, but it looks like we're well on our way to breaking that record this year after enduring the rainfall we've seen so far this month. Most of you can agree that working in constant rain just makes for a miserable day. Not to mention longer days due to an uptick in sick calls –mmm? But let's hope that the weather turns for the better this Spring. You know, like mid 70's and no rain for all of April and May. I mean, who wants to cut grass anyways?

But for this month's article for our monthly Newsletter, I want to express appreciation to all the members, active and retired, who've "voluntarily" contributed to the Letter Carrier Political Fund (LCPF) in 2018. This month's Postal Record lists the names of all the members in the NALC that contributed a few bucks out of their paychecks to support folks who support us. To explain the purpose of LCPF, in a nutshell so to speak, is to make sure we have friends in Congress that share our interest. We all know that our political system is basically broken since legislative votes are often given to the highest contributors. In other words, if you want to make sure you have friends in Congress that are willing to stand with you and vote on legislation that's in your best interest – it comes with a cost. That's just how it is folks. And we must acknowledge that it takes a heck of a lot more of us working folks to raise just a fraction of the money some special interest groups or billionaires contribute to make sure legislatures are voting in their interest.

After reviewing the names listed in the Postal Record, it's found that 112 members of Branch 14 contributed to LCPF in 2018. That's just 9.68% of the Branch membership. And a lot of those members listed are retired members. That's an indication that many of our retired members are still participating in our interests, the protection of our jobs and our retirements, and understand that we must have legislators who are willing to vote in our interest. As a branch, we've got to acknowledge that our retired folks have fought their battles over their careers and that it's time for more of our younger members to step up and play a bigger role at protecting our interest and our jobs. So, I think we can and should do better in the participation rate of members contributing to LCPF.

There are instructions listed in the Postal Record for anyone who wants to start contributing to LCPF. It's not difficult to sign up and you can choose the amount of money that fits your budget to donate each month. And for some reason you need some assistance, we always have someone available at the end of every union meeting that can help you out. But again, donations are entirely voluntary.



VT HACKNEY WORKHORSE An all-electric prototype with a small BMW gasoline engine that acts as a generator to extend the range of the truck.









TOM WEBB Health Benefits/Retirement

Explanation of Benefits;

The explanation of benefits (EOB) is the statement of service that was provided to you by a preferred provider or facility. The EOB contains the providers name and service provided, date of service, billed charges, and Remarks Code. This is a very important document to both you and the NALC Health Plan. Carefully review the EOB statement that you receive from the Plan for accuracy to ensure that you have not been billed for services that you did not receive.

The Remarks Code column will contain one or more series of three numbers, they contain information that explains the services provided. These numbers are necessary if you need to contact the NALC Health Plan concerning the service provided. The Claim Summery has the cost of service that was covered under insurance or coinsurance, any discounts, and your out of pocket liability.

Health Care Fraud increases the cost of health insurance for everyone and increases your Federal Employees Health Benefits premium. If you suspect that a provider has charged you for services that you did not receive, billed you twice for the same service or mis-represented any information, contact the provider and ask for an explanation. If that does not resolve the matter, call 703-729-4677 or 888-636-6252. The final option is to contact O.P.M. at 877-499-7295.

If you are ever injured on the job make sure you report it immediately to your supervisor, and I recommend you contact your steward as well. Management may ask, "well are you sure you want to report this, it goes on your record, and I have to call the post master." Well yes, you still want to report your injury, and you need to fill out all paperwork before seeking medical attention if possible. All this information can be found on our branch website. Knowledge is power!


