Formula: School CRT SkillsUSA member = ____ / 90 X 24 = # ____ School Contestants

164 = Number of Statewide AST SkillsUSA Members

24 = Maximum seating for contest

Example if your school had 15 members one would divide that number by 90 x 24 totaling 4.000 allowing that school to enter 4 student in the competition. The only time a number is rounded up if the number is below 0.1 giving that school an opportunity to compete. Exception to the rule would be if we did not max out the contest availability. Another exception to the rule would be if we exceeded the Max capacity of the contest then we may eliminate schools that only enroll 1 member to compete in a particular formula contest. The schools that may be eliminated from the formula contest are encouraged to enroll students in the Job Skill A or Job Skill Open contest still giving students the opportunity to win a medal and possibility attend the National Conference.

NOTE: If your school was eliminated from the formula due to low enrollment, or if you would like more students to compete in this contest from your school, fill out the Contest Alternate Form. If a spot comes available, we select from the forms submitted.

CONTEST UPDATES:

TOOL LIST:

- Eye, ear, nose and hand protection is required of all Contestants
- Clamps to hold fenders and welding coupons need to be supplied by the Contestants
- Milton type 'A' air hose connectors and air hoses with school names taped over must be supplied by the Contestants as well as Air gun blower chucks with type 'A' connectors
- Wire cutters must be supplied by the Contestants
- There is NO SPOT WELDING exercise
