

They were then moved from their various locations to the West Bay quarry area to serve as quarters for the quarry workers. 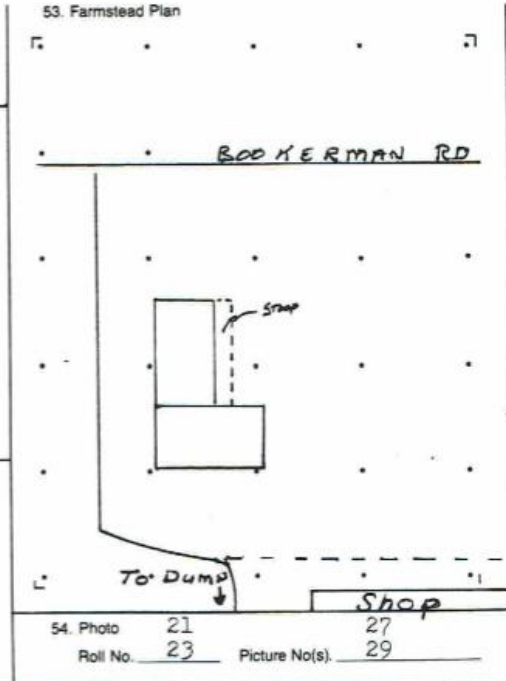

An historic photograph of this house suggests a house once located near the West Bay at the former end of Cameron Road. This is further supported by an oral report that indicated this house was moved from a hill north of Bookerman Rd. that once marked the island's highest ground, but was leveled by quarrying c.1913-15. The historic owner or date of construction is not known. It is known to have been occupied by the Mervo family in the 20's.
