The Church of Jesus Christ is mentioned 110 times in the New Testament. 93 times the focus is on the local church. The Church is not a building, but the people who worship in it. Church (ekklesia- Greek) means "called out ones." Jesus Christ is both God and king. He is also the head of the church. Each local congregation is an embassy of the kingdom of God. Each believer is a citizen of the kingdom of Heaven. 2 Corinthians 5: 20 explains that each believer is also an ambassador for Jesus Christ. As such, Christians represent Him wherever they go. Consequently, we should not present our own views, but those of Jesus Christ. We know His views by studying the Bible, which is the "word of God." We should always strive to glorify Him in all that we do.
