Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

John 1:29-34

“He must increase; I must decrease” (John 3:30) This is John’s humble admission of his ‘little’ role in Jesus’ ministry. John is only an opening act to the full drama of redemption accomplished by Jesus Christ. John needs to ‘Exit-Stage Left’, as Jesus assumes Center Stage. So, John defers and repeatedly points Jesus out to people. John tells us about Jesus, ***“He is the One...!”*** (Jn 1:30) This might sound paradoxical but John’s humility cannot be overplayed. And the key to understanding a few puzzles in today’s gospel comes down to appreciating this humility of John the Baptist. John will twice point out Jesus by title “Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world” (John 1:29, 36). John’s job description given by the angel to Zechariah about him, was that John would “go before the Lord.....to prepare a people fit for the Lord” (Lk 1:17). John prepared people for the Messiah’s coming, that “one mightier than I, is coming, ... who will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire” (Lk 3:16). But two puzzles are presented by John’s speech in today’s gospel. The **first** puzzle is John’s enigmatic saying, “A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me” (Jn 1:30, which he had already said word for word back in John 1:15). That is a twisting head-turner literally. It makes us look backward, then forward, then backward again. Jesus shows up in earth-time **after** John, but Jesus had existed in heaven time forever **before**! Why does this even come up? Because of a bias, that those who come later, like students or disciples, cannot be greater than what was first such as original teachers and masters. The glory days are always the older days, right? (*that’s the bias- which is really just as wrong as the other direction’s bias, that anything new is automatically an improvement!*) So, to a crowd that venerated elders and ancients, John was saying *“Though coming after me in time, Jesus is superior to me, because in fact, He has existed before time!”* Really, Jesus was before John! Just like Jesus was before ancient ancestor Abraham, too. Jesus will play His ‘age-card’ later when disputing with the scribes, in John 8:58 “I say to you, before Abraham came to be, I AM.” So. Even though in time, Jesus appears to be a disciple of John, in fact, Jesus is master.

And the **second** puzzle, comes from what seems to be John’s feigned ignorance of who Jesus is. Twice John says, “I did not know him” (Jn 1:31,33). Okay, this is John humbly denying that his connection to Jesus is anything other than God’s gratuity’s grace. It is not any merit of John that he can pick out the Messiah (John is not a powerful ‘king-maker’). It is not any effort of John’s special study or accomplished task that he designates the ‘Messiah’. No, it is purely God knowing and God informing John at the appropriate time to reveal Jesus to the world. John was simply affirming that it was the Spirit of God informing him (Lk 1:15, 17), not John’s own human effort that made him know. John is saying, “I do not know this humanly – it is God’s divine inspiration that lets me know”. I find another comparable, divinely informed (not human) revelation of Jesus’ identity later when Peter announces that Jesus is ‘The Christ’. In Matthew 16:17, there Jesus responds to Peter’s revelation, “Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father.” Peter, like John the Baptist, are being told by the Spirit about Jesus’ identity, and they are not coming up with it on their own. That is a humbling admission and recognition. Likely, this same humbling insight about how we even know God, is what St Paul is reinforcing when he will say in 1 Corinthians 12:3 “No one can say, “Jesus is Lord,” except by the holy Spirit.” (1 John 4:10 not that we loved God, but that He loved us first” & John 15:16 “It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you”). So, yes, John the Baptist did know Jesus on some level, but it was by grace. He knew not by any authority of his own, but the Holy Spirit’s. And of course, for us all, this identity of Jesus is confirmed publicly, at that moment of His baptism, when the Holy Spirit came down upon Jesus as a dove, and the Father’s voice announced, ‘This is my beloved Son’ (Jn 1:31-34, Mt 3:13–17, Mk 1:9–11, & Lk 3:21–22). And not only Jesus’ identity is proclaimed, but we also received confirmation of who the whole Divine Trinity is - God as Father, Son & Spirit is revealed at that moment! And Blessed are we to know God now through Jesus!
