

THE PROTECTION OF ALL HUMAN LIFE AND THE PROMOTION OF HUMAN OF HUMAN

It should be no surprise that "Human Dignity" is judged as the bedrock of Catholic Social Justice Teaching. Humans were created in the image and likeness of God that includes an undeniable dignity that cannot be taken away. Yet, in our present-day society, human life is under direct attack from abortion and euthanasia. The value of human life is threatened by embryonic stem cell research, unregulated sperm and egg donation, the ruin

of the natural family, in turn encouraging family separation and fragmentation, and the use of the death penalty. As Catholics, we are called to acknowledge and teach that the sanctity of life and the inherent dignity of the human person is to be valued infinitely above material possessions. Catholic teaching embraces the teaching of opposition to war, abortion, the death penalty, racism, and any discrimination as a foundational principle. The Church takes a strong and rigid position on issues of


life being sacred from the moment of conception until natural death. It also speaks to the need to support of all those with disabilities, global inequality, and our approach to civil rights issues. It is from these teachings that the themes of 'Preferential Option for the Poor' and 'Authentic Human Development' are revealed. Ed.
