

A Note from Pastor Toni

As I sit down to write my February Bridge article, I am keenly aware that change is on the horizon for us as United Methodists and followers of Jesus Christ. We are in a season of change although not a typical seasonal change. A change that will require of each one of us, courage, strength, grace, and above all honor and love; love of self, enough to invite change within ourselves, and love of neighbor, enough to demonstrate compassion for individual feelings and understandings, as well as acceptance of differences and opinions

Church, we are followers of Jesus Christ! We are called by His example and leadership to model His sacrificial love and His dependence on His Father; seeking God's intention and direction regardless of our feelings. When we are covenanted to *that* commitment, it is enough to conquer any challenge of differences and regard only our love [for one another] as that which can overcome, just as love overcame on our behalf at the cross.

Last Sunday we listened to the story of redemption and forgiveness through the heart and voice of Michelle Caswell and her husband, Matt. It will help you take the next step in finding and following Jesus as you connect with other disciples who have a desire to become all that God intended them to be for His Kingdom work on earth! *Purely His* is about getting <u>vourself</u> unstuck from those regrets, choices and circumstances that have left you with scars of guilt and shame that more often than not keep you from experiencing healing, forgiveness, joy and the fullness of the love of God. PLEASE church, I ask each one of you to thoughtfully consider entering into a covenant relationship with 6-8 others, with the intention of taking the next step into your God-given purpose.

We are supposed to be about making disciples for the transformation of the world. We say that our mission is to partner with God in bringing people to the transforming power in Jesus Christ. But how can we make disciples when we ourselves are not yet the kind of follower who is equipped to do so because of our own hurts, habits and hang-ups? Can we as a church who say we love one another, take a step up to use the tools that God is offering us through the <u>Purely His</u> ministry? In the days to come, as United Methodists, we will face the possibility of painful and potentially difficult decisions to make as the Body of Christ. I believe that God has brought this ministry to us for such a time as this, to provide a way of living that will allow all of us to grow in God's grace and a deeper understanding of who we are as His child and who we can become as His disciples.

I love you YUMC, and I am committed to lead you this year with a new-found direction and hope, that in humility God will give us the courage and strength that He promised Joshua!



Nancy presented the devotion entitled "Celebrate the Light." This is the time of Epiphany -- a time of revelation. It is the dawning of light in the dark corners of our lives. Jesus Christ is that Light. Celebrate!
