Position Information

Position Title: Paid-on-Call Firefighter

<u>Hours</u>: There are no set hours. Members are expected to attend two training sessions per month, respond to calls, participate in fundraisers and community events based on availability. <u>Pay</u>: Firefighters are paid \$50 per month for performing equipment checks and maintenance duties and \$25 per hour upon call out.

Applicant Eligibility

To be eligible to apply, applicants must:

- Be 18 year of age or older
- No older than 65 years of age
- Legally entitled to work in Canada
- Live primarily in the Fort Qu'Appelle area
- Be willing to learn firefighting methods and techniques, the basic operation and mechanics of firefighting equipment and other knowledge related to firefighting and rescue operations

Duties of a Firefighter

- Provide protection to the community through the fire service's three lines of defense: education, enforcement & emergency response
- Responding to emergencies and public service calls as a member of the fire department and performing the duties associated with the call response
- Acting in a professional manor while representing the Fort Qu'Appelle Fire Department
- Driving and operating fire apparatus
- Selecting and operating the proper tools for a wide variety of specialized tasks
- Performing routine cleaning and maintenance on equipment and fire apparatus
- Performing general maintenance and upkeep of the fire hall, including housekeeping duties
- Attending training meetings and participating in drills, activities and discussions
- Participating in public education/relations events such as: hall tours, presentations and public appearances
- Providing assistance and informally training new firefighters on the daily operations of the job
- Performing other duties as assigned

The Next Steps After Submitting Your Application

- 1. Once your application has been submitted it will be reviewed to determine if you meet the minimum criteria. If you meet the minimum criteria you will be invited for a first interview.
- 2. In the first interview, you will be asked a variety of questions by a panel made up of the Chief, Deputy Chief and 1-3 Captains. If you pass the first-round interview, you will be called for a second.
- 3. In the second-round interview, you will be invited to one of our meetings. In this interview, each member present will have the opportunity to ask you a question.
- 4. Your application and two interviews will be reviewed and the members will hold a vote. You will be notified of the results.

- 2. Please <u>PRINT</u> clearly. Illegible applications will be discarded.
