**Food Bank Focus** – The "urgent need" for August is protein products. Often our undernourished clients are craving protein so badly that they come to our door begging for a jar of peanut butter. They sit on the steps with a plastic spoon and eat it immediately. Examples are: canned meats - tuna, chicken, spam; jerky; different cheese products; peanut butter, etc.
