This year's conference, *Make Radiant Room*, was hosted by AOCSN member, Twelveacres, an organization serving individuals with special needs located in Campbell, California. Our staff management and Board Vice President attended in-person while the majority of the board attended online. The Desert View team participated in this important worthwhile event and brought home much food for thought.



AOCSN Conference April 29 - May 2, 2024

When the "call to conference letter" was received, Administrator Chris Radel says, "right away I began to ponder Mary Baker Eddy's words from her Communion Hymn, 'and for you make radiant room/midst the glories of one endless day.' What was that saying to me about our upcoming conference? I knew Love was calling the Christian Science nursing community together; that Love would go ahead to prepare the way. I knew that Love would be present, filling the room, and we would feel that embrace. And I knew Love would guide each of us home, spiritually armed with fresh inspiration and new views of the healing work. The anticipation was immediate, and my expectations were met."

After 54 years in Christian Science nursing, Director of Christian Science Nursing, Priscilla Root thought, "what am I going to get out of a conference about Christian Science nursing? Haven't I heard it all before? Having said that I can say I got a lot out of the 3-day meeting in surprising and inspiring ways.

First, to see so many Christian Science nurses from different states and worldwide and to hear their questions and solutions was deeply inspiring. To see a huge room filled with dedicated Christian Science workers, healers, and ambassadors for Christian Science was very moving and important to me. Most folks may not realize this but most Christian Science nurses work alone on many if not most of their cases. So, for me to hear how other's in the DCSN role are working through the challenges was very helpful."

Both Chris and Priscilla spoke of the strong bond uniting the Christian Science nursing community. It does not matter where a facility is located or how big/small it is, we are facing most of the same challenges and we are collaborating with each other as we seek solutions. Everyone appreciated the admonition, "Don't take ownership of the suggestion of limitation," and "remember we manage growth, not decline."



The AOCSN conference was a wonderful opportunity for nearly all the Executive Board to experience the direct benefits from the great fellowship and community of like-minded, dedicated volunteers in the field of Christian Science nursing. Here are some valuable takeaways for us . . .

What did we bring?

Our participation contributed to the supporting atmosphere for all. Also, we brought a thirst for a greater appreciation of Christian Science nursing, and a desire to put new ideas into practice.

What did we get from the conference?

Inspiration - Being on the Board can feel like a heavy responsibility – meeting the needs of Christian Scientists in our community. This conference was a reminder that God is the only Cause and Creator, expressing His will through the Christ consciousness. Our role then is to recognize our true responsibility is <u>to</u> the process, and not <u>for</u> the outcome, since divine Love will provide the ultimate resolution. And to let Christ be the way, the how, the why. The most important responsibility Board members have is to *pray*. Healing, not just loving care, is central to Christian Science nursing.

A sense of the constant unfolding of what Christian Science nursing is - a very informative historical sketch of Christian Science nursing was shared, culminating in an appreciation of the sense of unity and collaboration that is continuing to grow and spread through our organizations. We are all in this together!

Affirmation that Desert View is an important contributor in the development of Christian Science nursing - as Desert View keeps listening to see how to develop Christian Science nursing opportunities that divine Love is providing, it becomes clearer that we are willing to do our part to support both the Christian Science nursing field and the Christian Science community. Part of this process is to reach out to our community to better understand what are the current needs – both simple and more involved – and how can we contribute to meeting these needs and support healing.

Desert View is part of a wonderful, supportive network that not only cares for Christian Scientists in the community but cares for those that are caring for others.
