

Why Suffering Is Increasing 1 of 2

Your sufferings are throwing millions of life savers floating to those who are drowning in the darkness of hatred, war, despair, confusion and utter abandonment, or so they think. The Lord is raising up an army of warriors willing to engage the enemy in battle and take the hits in their own lives to save those lost in the darkness.

These hits can be painful and offered up to the Lord as if they were fast offerings. I was once such a one, lost in darkness, not knowing which end was up, not knowing who to believe, not knowing for a certainty what was the truth until Jesus apprehended me one night and pulled me out of my pit. Yes, He did a wonder in my life and showed to me the difference between all the religions on this Earth and Himself. I do not say His religion because He longs for relationship with each of us and religion is like a mechanical structure with moving parts, rules and regulations, jots and tittles, but relationship is embracing the very Creator of the universe. Not a faraway embrace, but a heart-to-heart embrace, where He feels what you feel, He knows your lostness and confusion and has embraced you to wash away all the lies in the matrix of darkness, with His tender love, encouragement, and illumination.

Once that relationship is established, all the rest can be clarified, and He can bring you into the fullness of the faith. But without that relationship, you are at the mercy of men’s opinions. And much has been changed, through the centuries, stripping away things the Lord left us in the church to help us live a sanctified life. But if we seek the truth, and only the truth without bias, eventually He will establish us in the truth, but without that

relationship, we are at the mercy of opinions of men. And that is very much what Heart Dwellers are all about, is embracing the Lord's heart, totally, and allowing Him to set us straight in our thinking.

Dear ones, men have agendas, and ever since the Lord created the early church, agendas have been changed by men, and other churches have been begun. The Lord is the only one who began His church in Jerusalem in thirty-three AD at Pentecost, He established His church, He picked the Apostles and their successors coming up through the line, all the way to present time. That does not mean that the men are perfect, there are always flaws and the devil has done much damage to the church to bring it down.

It is worth serious consideration that Martin Luther established his church in Germany in fifteen seventeen, with the Protestant reformation...many influential persons of that time jumped on the band wagon with him, but they deleted very important doctrines that Martin Luther did not want deleted. For instance, Luther had a strong devotion to the Mother of Jesus, but others who were not warm to her intercession and her position in Heaven, took the liberty to remove that, planting instead empty and deceptive arguments against the Cloud of Witnesses and lumping her in with the selling of indulgences which was a twisted corrupt doctrine used to accumulate money.

To this day, mainline Christians have no connection with Heaven's intercessors, nor do they understand that the Bible was birthed out of the church in three hundred AD. That is why they make such frequent statements like, 'Well, I only believe in the Bible and what it teaches, I do not need anything else', well, they are not realizing that the early Christians did not have a Bible, they lived within the framework of letters and holy traditions passed on by the Holy Ghost and later ratified by the consensus of Bishops in three hundred AD, creating the Canon of the Bible.

The point is, Luther founded his church in fifteen seventeen, John Calvin in France in fifteen thirty-six, William Tyndale, Aimee Semple McPherson, John Knox and on and on and on, founded their churches through the centuries, but Jesus gave birth to His church in thirty-three AD, in Jerusalem, so a lot of reformation has taken place going from one generation to the next, a of changes based on culture and convenience, and especially, political motivation, political pressures. And these compromises have done a great deal of damage to the integrity of the early church have had an influence on what the church teaches until you arrive here at the modern church that has lost a great deal of the real character of those who walked with Jesus.

I think it is a very stark picture of the life that was led by the early Christians. In the film series "The Chosen", you can really see the simplicity of the Apostles that Jesus picked. Totally different from the wealthy and the highly educated people of today. My search for the Lord was based on getting to the bottom line, the truth. I had seen all kinds of doctrines and spiritual practices, but none were the truth until Jesus apprehended me. Little did I know that even in the Christian communities, there was a wide divergence of opinion about how the Scriptures should be interpreted.

That is what led me to what the Apostles taught and how Christianity grew into the very rich faith that it is, beginning in thirty-three AD. And I am sorry to say modern Christians bear very little resemblance to first century Christians.

Even though the Catholic and Orthodox churches retain much of the early church liturgical life, because remember, they were coming out of the Jewish temple life.
