Quote from page 306 " After killing the defeated Chief, he {Standish} mounted the severed head on a pole in front of Plymouth Colony as a warning" It is recorded that the pole and head remained mounted on a hill for many years to intimidate the Natives!

A defining characteristic of Standish's military leadership was his proclivity for **preemptive** action, which resulted in at least two attacks on different groups of Native Americans the Nemasket raid and the Wessagusset massacre. Such European barbaric behavior was known through the Spanish Cortez and many others.
