"Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. Have you ever seen a turtle who cannot get away react to a predator or aggressor? They "turtle," which is to say, they pull their head, arms and legs within their shell and they close up. Lukewarm people, or more accurately lukewarm churches often do the same thing. When threats arise that could destroy or close a church, lukewarm members will turn inward and shut out the outside world, assuming that if they just take care of themselves, then they will survive. The problem with this mentality is that it is not Christian and get the church and its people nowhere. A turtle cannot move while it is closed up in its shell, it cannot eat or drink and if it stays there too long, it will die of starvation or dehydration. If a church "turtles" up in the face of low numbers, it also will be unable to move, particularly in the Spirit and worse it will cut itself off from spiritual nourishment and growth. Nothing new can come into the shell, but waste will still leave. Think about all the wasted gifts and talents that are lost to the world and the Church when a congregation turns inward. On fire Christians, will see the same adversity that a lukewarm Christian sees and choose to give it their all. Rather than "turtling," on fire Christians feel that if they are going down, they are going down swinging for Christ in a blaze of His glory. Their fire moves them, sustains them and leads them to new life.

Renovations to the basement are moving along. The dirt floor under the main sanctuary has been leveled and is now covered with concrete. This will be a big help with clean up the next time we have water in the basement. (It's Front Street, we know it's inevitable). The common wall between the social hall and the men's and women's room and kitchen has been constructed. All the drain lines, which will run under the floor, have been installed. By the time you read this newsletter, hopefully the plumbing will have been inspected and approved which will allow the floor to be cemented and the walls to continue to be built.

As you know, our church has significantly increased the number of employees. Although they do not always work in the office at the same time, the current office space is not adequate for the staff to work efficiently. We have begun to discuss how we may be able to make the office space more user friendly. No definitive decisions have been made, but you'll hear more about that in the future.

Lay Leader's Report

The Bethany wedding of Blaine Haas and Brittany Smith on August 20 was a great and beautiful success, with Pastor Damien performing the ceremony in our fully decked-out main sanctuary before about 80 family and guest attendees. The church is now preparing for the September 24 wedding of Chad Miller and Shelly Buck. There is another wedding scheduled for here in December 2017, and we were approached on September 18 about a possible wedding on July 22, 2017. So we are becoming an attraction as a marriage venue, and let's be glad about that.

My official certification as a Lay Speaker for the District is contingent on my completing 5 special courses, four of which are on line and one of which involves face-to-face sermon delivery. I have completed one of the on line courses (on United Methodist organization and polity), I'm about halfway through my second course (on United Methodist history and heritage), I have two sessions before District Superintendent Leland coming up shortly (on preaching), and I have two other on-liners that I'll be taking in October and November (one on leading public prayer and one on spiritual gifts). If all goes well, I should be fully qualified as a District Lay Speaker by this Thanksgiving.

Bethany members and friends of the church who took part in the August 20 5K Run/Walk were Pastor Damien, Joan Warburton, Sara Warburton, Justin Hopple, Justin Dunkle, and I. Sara and Justin Dunkle placed in the top 3 in their age groups, and we all had a wonderful time on a beautiful day in support of a very worthy cause. That was a fee-based event, but now we're gearing up to participate in the October 9 Milton CROP Walk, which is a free-will donation event, and we'd like to enter it as a church.

We have started an attendance logging system to collect the names and addresses of people who come to our Sunday evening Contemporary services. This will be very useful as that service grows, as it will identify the new folks who have been showing up and add completeness to the fellowship that we're developing with them.

After about a year of weekly readings and discussions, the Disciple I Bible study course is over. Karen Sheaffer and I, the lone graduates, plan to enter into the 34-week Disciple 2 course. Cheri Buss may join us, having herself taken Disciple I (the first Disciple course is a prerequisite for taking the second, making all three of us eligible to take Disciple 2). We will meet to decide on a mutually agreeable schedule.

Christian Education Committee....


Christian Education met at the end of August to plan for the Fall and future. It was decided within the meeting that Bethany would pursue a relationship with Christ Lutheran Church for the 2017 Vacation Bible School. The theme of the Bible School will be "Hero Central" from Cokesbury and take place at Christ Lutheran at some point to determined next summer. The cost for the Bible Study will be split between the two churches, volunteers and children will attend from both churches. It was also decided that the church would move forward in our plans to do the "Unbinding the Gospel" series this fall with the church leaders and the staff being asked to participate in "Unbinding the Gospel" first this fall and with the rest of the congregation being invited to participate in "Unbinding Your Heart" this coming Spring. The purpose of the study is help us reignite the spirit of evangelism within our church, starting first with our leaders and then moving to the congregation as a whole. This fall, we hope to help our leaders transform into spiritual leaders, this spring, we hope to transform the church into a force for the Holy Spirit. There will be one other study offered this fall, which will be written by Pastor Damien on the prophet Zechariah and run for 6 weeks. This study will be open to all participants. The final item for discussion at Christian Education was the formation of a Youth Group. Pastor Damien was encouraged to seek out a joint Youth Group with St. Andrew's as it was felt that a larger Youth Group would be better with responsibility falling elsewhere. After discussions with St. Andrew's, we will do some things jointly and some things separately as most spiritual growth happens in small group settings.

Ignite Youth Ministry...

I know that many have been anxious to see the results of all my work with teens and now as of the beginning of September, Bethany United Methodist Church will once again have a Youth Group. We have started to meet on Sunday evenings following Contemporary Service, where many of the youth attend and will also be looking forward to some joint ventures with the St. Andrew's youth group. This group is the product of the relationships I have been able to build at the Jungle and the addition of new attendees at Contemporary service. It was discussed in Christian Education with plans to move forward and reach out to St. Andrew's and their youth director Alaina Byers. As we continue forward, Christian Education will help select our curriculum to use for the instruction of the youth and help to train new volunteers in Safe Sanctuaries. Until then, the Youth Group will meet with the intent of turning attendance into a habit and be a fun, Christian environment for them to invite their friends to be a part of a church community. While we are currently operating without a budget or any expenses to the church, the Ad Board and Christian Education may choose to budget for it in the future and we hope to call on your support.

Thoughts of Board members are turning to the creation of the church budget for 2017, as the chairpersons of the various committees begin to plan for whatever predictable needs fall within their realms of responsibility.

Pastor Damien confirms that he will shortly be able to conduct Safe Sanctuaries training, which is important for us because some of our members in key positions still need that qualification in order to interact with (especially) youth. Besides, it's a fact that government abuse and police record clearances in that regard are not enough by themselves to satisfy UMC discipline.

The church plans to work on a form to be used whenever Bethany spaces or services are rented out to other organizations.

The starter kit for 2017 VBS has been ordered. Christ Evangelical Lutheran, with whom we will partner to conduct that event, is on board with our choice of theme for it.
