Don and Pat Snyder



Don and Pat Snyder are key formative and foundational members of our club. They joined Lakeside when the Richland Three Rivers Club and Lakeside merged in the 1960s. The couple's story and long standing relationship is applause worthy. They have known each other for 73 years, when Don, who was in high school, moved from California to Richland and began working for Pat's father's laundry, dry cleaning and linen supply company, which today is US Linen and Uniform. Don and Pat married in 1956, and in time took over ownership and management of the linen supply company. They have 3 children, 10 grandchildren and numerous great grandchildren spread throughout the country.

Don is a second generation rock hound. He was just a tyke when his father took him rock hounding in Southern California. He remembers having a rock collection at five and that was the start of an incredible desire to get outdoors and explore the earth's bounty. Don reminds us that the Northwest, which encompasses Washington, Idaho, Montana, Utah, Oregon and Northern California, has a wide range of geological material. Many times he and Pat have camped out with friends for several days and rock hounded at such places as Madras Or., the Deschutes River, and Quartzite, to name a few. They also collected material from afar while traveling and attending rock shows.

Don and Pat have been extremely generous to the club, continuously donating door prize material, bags of rocks to sell at the LGMC show, or material for class work. Don has always enjoyed cutting and polishing rocks; he often has gifted material with the only stipulation being that he would like to see what people have worked with the material. Pat, with her warm and friendly smile, shows the sacks that the couple makes from retired linen for the door prize and other club donations; these recycle the cloth and provide safe and easy material storage and transport.
