pastor's letter

Dear Friends in Christ,

What a joy to see the sun!!! The warmth tells us, it's spring, transformation time! Romans 12: 2 "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your minds."

As we approach the day of Pentecost, June 5, I am reminded of Pastor Gerry White who read the story of Pentecost first in Greek and then in Norwegian, to remember the Holy Spirit gave utterance so that Peter's sermon was heard "each in their own language" (Acts 2: 1-13.) Pastor White served Hope Lutheran as our visitation pastor. For his memory we give God thanks.

This year we will be able to hear the text in a **Philippine dialect** similar to what is spoken and translated by our Philippine missionaries, Luke and Ruth Schroeder. Each island has its own dialect, just as we have southern, eastern, western or Scandinavian accents in each part of our country. We will hear the blessing of **the Acts 2: 1-12 Pentecost text** in the Philippine dialect from one of our own, Pat Eggers who was born and raised in the Philippines. Her Philippine dialect is called "tagalog". How interesting for us to have this Philippine connection with one of our own members right here in Fosston.

At the Augustana District Convocation, I met **Pastor Daniel R-26** from Madagascar. His last name is 27 letters long beginning with "R"; no one could pronounce it. So he good-naturedly goes by Daniel R-26. What a faithful man! He serves an AD mission on the St. Paul University campus and invites anyone to attend their 9:30 AM services. I asked Daniel about mission work. He said the mission work in the United States of America is tougher than anyplace in the world, he has ever been. I asked him if he knew why this could be so. He said that American **people are indifferent**; they don't care. I did not want him to believe him, but maybe he is right. Proverbs 30: 8-9 says ⁸Keep falsehood and lies far from me; give me neither poverty nor riches, but give me only my daily bread. ⁹Otherwise, I may have too much and disown you and say, 'Who is the LORD?' Or I may become poor and steal, and so dishonor the name of my God".

I thought about this. I guess it is easy to take our religious freedom and **all we enjoy for granted**. It is easy to think we are doing fine and do not need a savior. Easy to think we did it all by ourselves. It is easy to listen to the messages from the world and to get wrapped up in worldly wisdom. It is easy to get wrapped up in a culture of affluence when we feel pretty safe and secure.

Maybe that is why the church flourished when life was hard: during World War I, the Great Depression, and World War II. We humans invite God into our lives when we need Him most and feel the most helpless. When we are doing fine, we tend to forget **from whom our blessing flow**, and instead congratulate ourselves on our own success, not giving God thanks and praise. We can become apathetic about God, and find less meaning in life.

As we prepare to send our graduates into the world, I recall that one of my pastors said. "If we don't send our students out as missionaries, they come back as mission fields." At first, I thought that sounded unduly harsh. I think we have all known someone who either lost their faith or deliberately discarded it upon leaving home. Sometimes our prayers are answered and they find their way back. Others that we love, forsake their faith and never find their way back. (Continued on p. 4)

(Pastor's letter—continued)

My own cousin was raised in a fine Christian home, forsook the faith of his fathers and became a college professor in California. He authored several books, and raised his children outside the church. **In his last days**, he was visited by his neighbor, a retired minister who helped him find faith again. At his graveside service, few family members knew of his reawakened faith. His own brother, children, and grandkids were not sure they believed it. Consequently, they were hesitant to attend the Christian burial, unsure that he really wanted it.

When we stray, others (like our children) follow us. We teach more often by example than by words. Faith comes by hearing, if we do not hear, we do not contemplate the Word. When we hear the Word, the Holy Spirit does his work on and in us. It is not the pastor, the music, or the church. It is the Holy Spirit that speaks to us and softens our hardened hearts and minds.

Like Spring, allowing the Spirit to renew us is transforming. Paul tells us to be lifelong learners in Romans 12: 2 "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your minds." Enjoy this wonderful season of transformation. Let's not be afraid to be transformed!
