



Some of the charts are from previous reports but those reflecting this current report's attempts at tracing living relative are all new, updated.




The brothers Fitzpatrick (see current July 2019 Research Report) were running various restaurants, bowling alleys etc., at Providence RI by the turn of the century. John McKearney's 1899 Naturalization papers cites Patrick Fitzpatrick junior (above b. 1863) as having known him for at least 10 years, inferring the family connection and that they had likely met prior to c. 1881 when the Fitzpatricks emigrated from England (where they had been for around 15 years) to Rhode Island.



in the Tynan Catholic register, between 1858 and 1861. The next child Patrick's baptism is registered in the Monaghan parish (Co. Monaghan) register in northern England where a daughter Catherine was baptized and who likely died in infancy. Their next 6 sons were born 1868-1879 in or near the area of he FITZPATRICK family - Patrick Fitzpatrick and wife Catherine McNaughtan - appear to have originated from Tynan where they married in 1857 where witnesses to the event were Thomas McNatten and Henry Hughes. Edward Fitzpatrick at Bar Harbor, Maine). Patrick her sons - James, Patrick, Francis, Michael, Peter and Edward. Sons John, Daniel and Joseph are not included in this listing so they either had already left Fitzpatrick, the father of the family, is absent from this census of April 1881, as is eldest son Thomas (b.1858) - possibly they were already at Providence, The family do not appear to have emigrated from Leeds all at once. The 1881 census shows Catherine Fitzpatrick (nee McNaughtan) with sons John, England or did so at a later date. What is certain is that the entire family emigrated to Providence. Rev Edward Francis Fitzpatrick's various biographical and autobiographical records narrates that his father Patrick Fitzpatrick (b.c.1835-37 Co. Armagh) to c.1882. This is not final, though as one child remains to be accounted for - census refers to Mary McNaughton having had 8 children, 4 living in 1900. It would appear from the record evidence that somehow the plot was maintained by the emigrant family – with in later years someone else (a relative?) farming it, probably even purchasing it. Tracing this plot forwards in time through the Irish land purchase records would be interesting as any living relatives may be more inclined to know of the farm's history, involving original tenants who emigrated to Providence RI.

Drumgolat in turn borders the clues left (via Nellie's 1980s letters) by the McNally brothers James (6.1908 above) and Francis Richard (6.1909 above) wo were then in their early 70s. 
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Further Notes on McNally of Tullycomiskey Townland family chart:

any recording her mother's pre-married name - which for reasons covered in previous reports, is assumed to be Fitzpatrick. The 1830 Tithe record for Tullycomiskey lists a Patrick McNally, with just over 3 acres. This may be the father of Ellen but further research to obtain further original sources would be advisable the question is were the family at Tullycomiskey in James McNally's (6.c.33) childhood. Ellen McNally's and her mother's name given as Margaret (the surname is not recorded). This is the only record source from which we have the names of Ellen's parents and further original sources would be good, especially (McKearney) father's name is recorded as Patrick McNally from her 1912 Providence RI death record, Given that James McNally (b.c.1833) is proposed as brother to Ellen McNally (McKearney) (b.c.1840), for verification.

This McNally at Tullycomiskey family were certainly known to Ellen McNally (McKearney) for reasons covered in this current (July 2019) report.

Co. Monaghan versions (along with those for all of the Irish Free State) are not online, although digitized but only accessible house with siblings Francis (6.1861), Rose (6.c.1859) and Ann (6.c.1860). Like the McKearneys, they are not there as early as time of the 1881 census and netther were their younger children - Patrick b.1866, James b.1863 and Ellen b.c.1864, who were McInally. The Valuation Revison Books, similar to those used previously, for Tynan parish, which shows tenancies and dates of their changing hands, should be looked at for Clontibret but unlike the Co. Armagh versions which are online, the 1871 so perhaps arrived at Rutherglen around the same time as the McKearneys. 

Further research here is certainly possible to try to further better define the Fitzpatrick links to the McKearney ancestry. So far, I have not investigated whether the above Hughes family also went to Providence.
