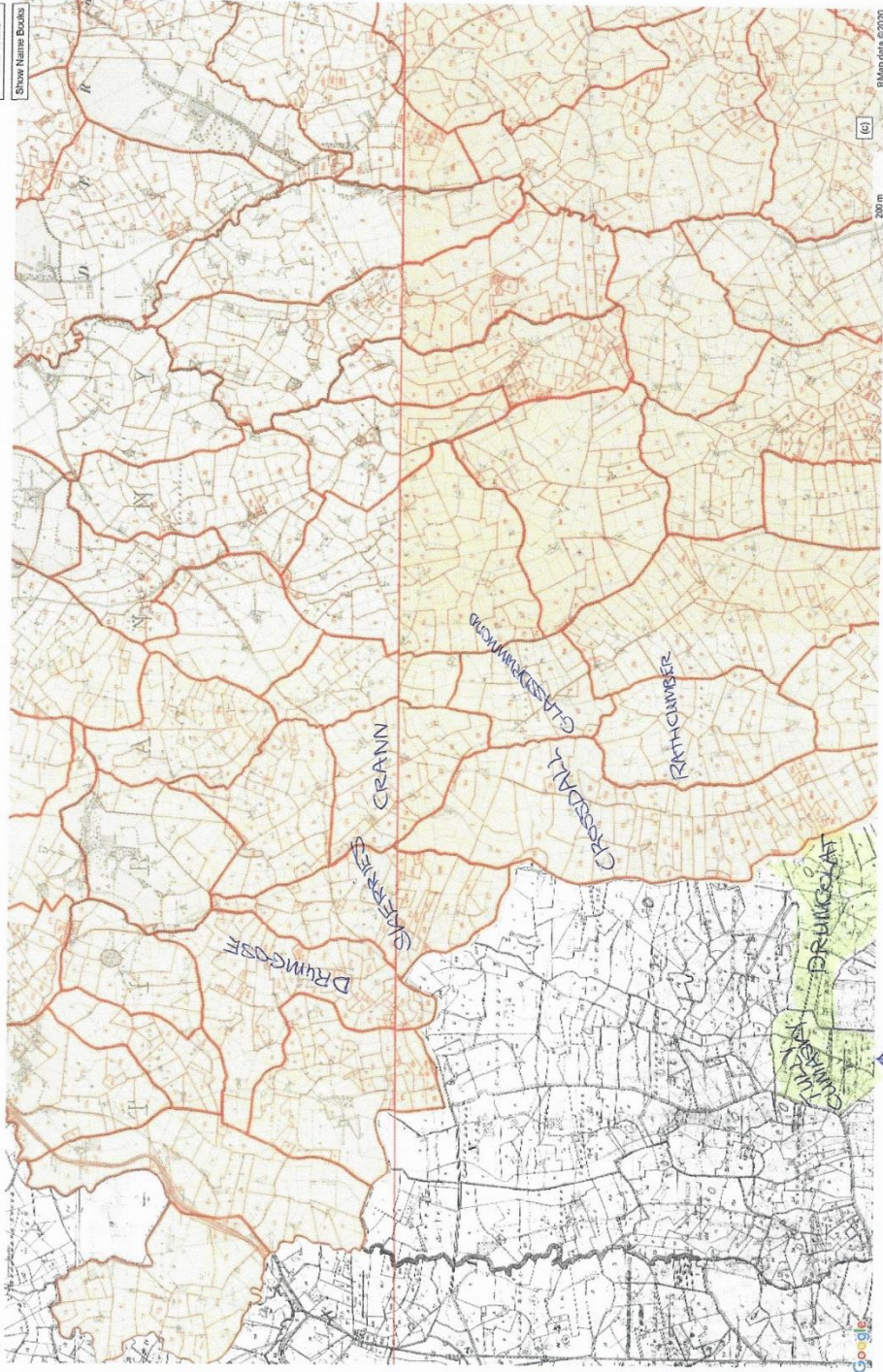

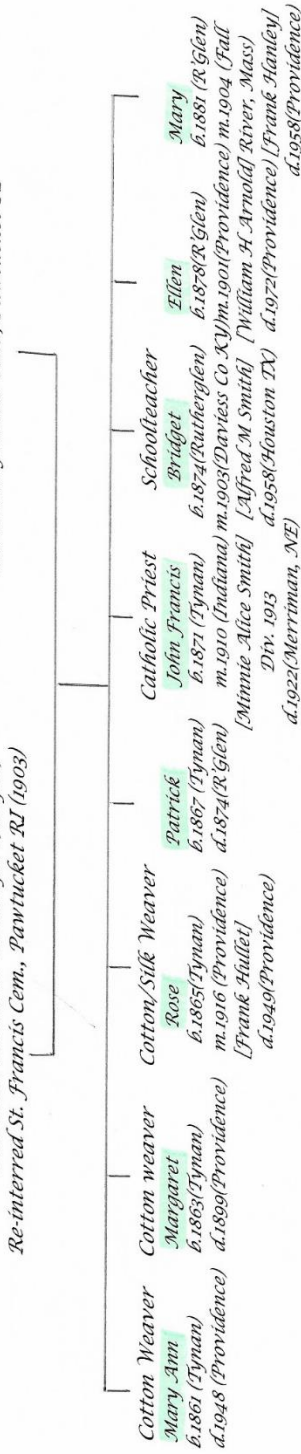

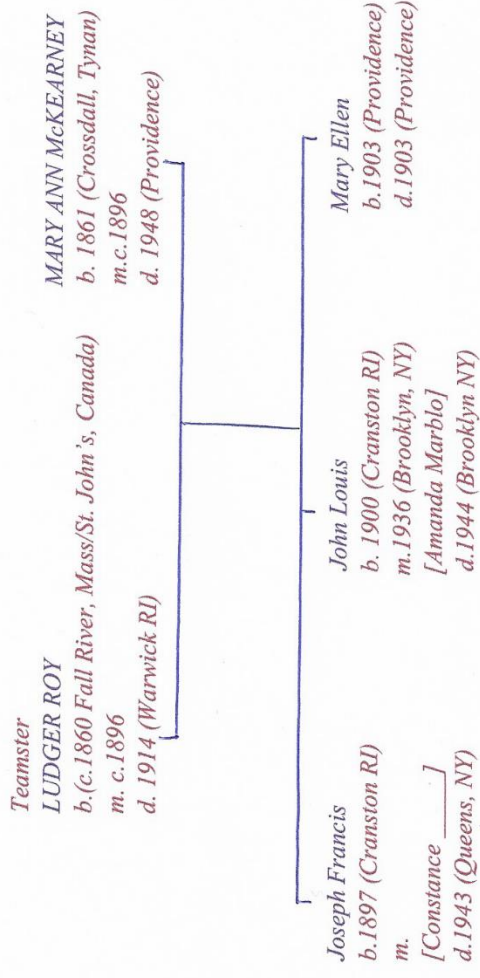

There is no formal marriage record of Joseph Francis Roy to Lillian Florence Bristo. At death his wife was called Constance. No children known to John Louis.

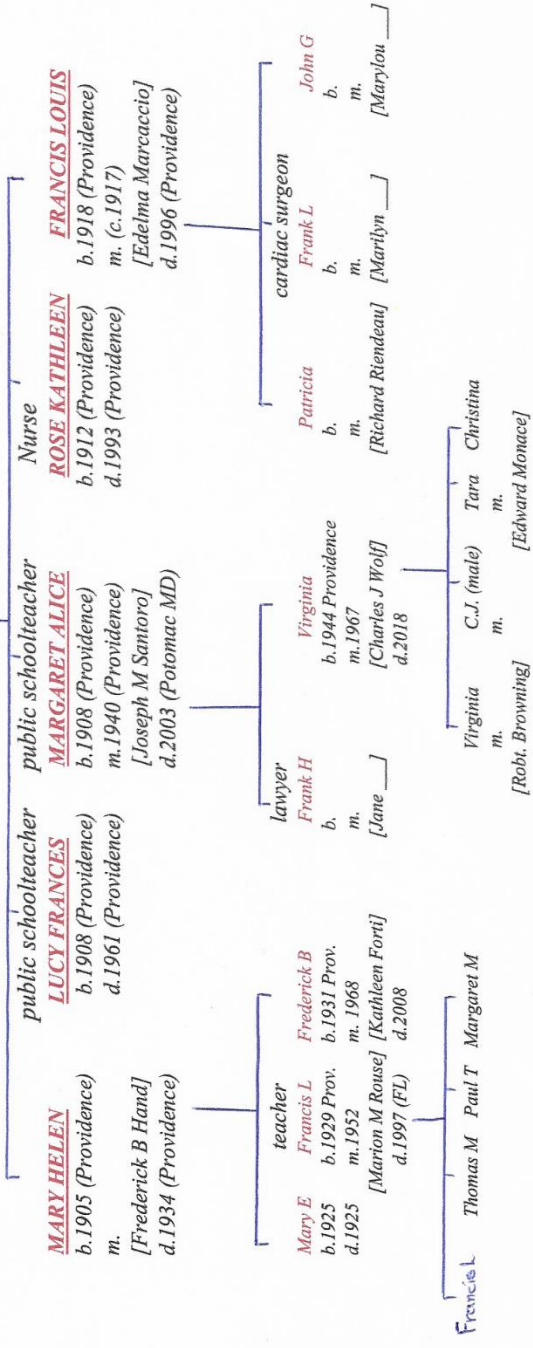

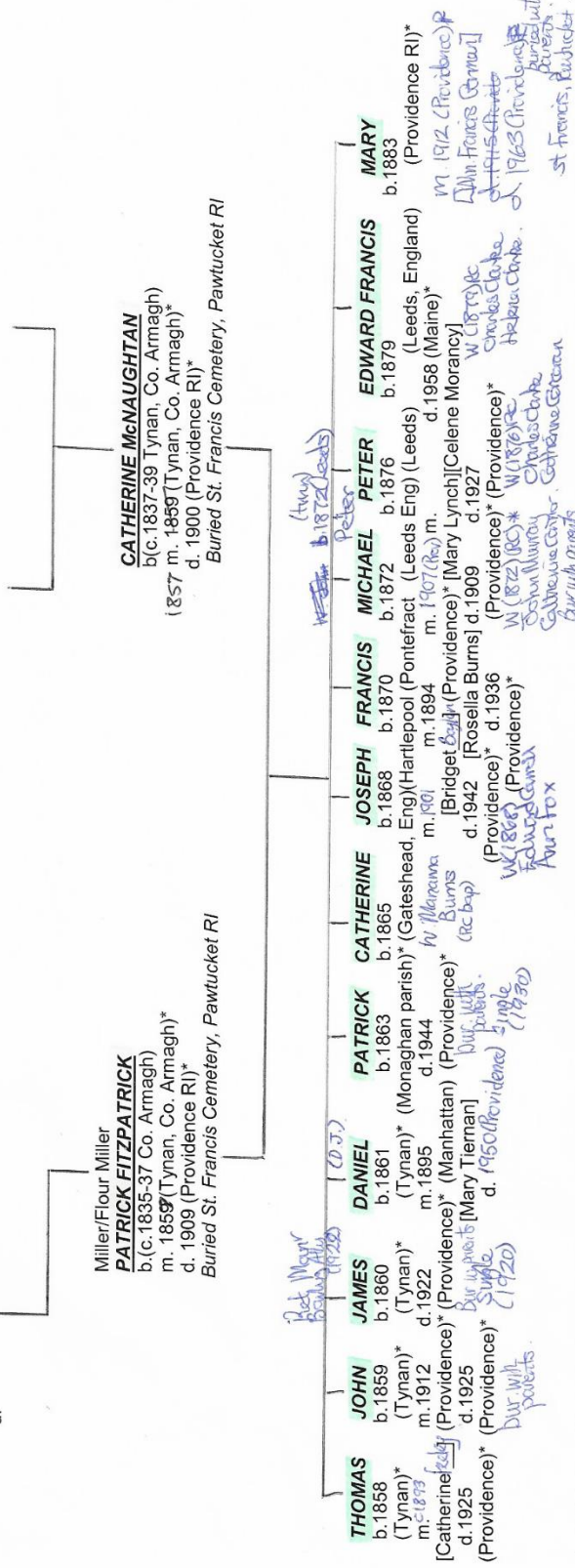

Notes: Above is family tree of the FITZPATRICK family from Tynan, Co. Armagh, referred to as cousins of Rev John F McKearey (d.1922) (ref. Providence newspaper report of his funeral). The celebrant at John McKearey's funeral was his cousin, the above Rev. Edward Francis Fitzpatrick (b.1879) and bearers at said funeral were Rev. Edward's older brothers as above - Daniel (b.1861 Tynan), John (b.1859 Tynan), Patrick (b.1863 Monaghan parish, Co. Monaghan) and Francis (b.1870 Ponteprat, England). Francis also had a son Edward Francis Fitzpatrick (b.c.1896 Providence) who became a priest and it may be he who is referred to as deacon at John McKearey's funeral.

The brothers Fitzpatrick (see current July 2019 Research Report) were running various restaurants, bowling alleys etc., at Providence RI by the turn of the century. John McKearey's 1899 Naturalization papers cites Patrick Fitzpatrick junior (above b.1863) as having known him for at least 10 years, inferring the family connection and that they had likely met prior to c.1881 when the Fitzpatricks emigrated from England (where they had been for around 15 years) to Rhode Island.

The FITZPATRICK family - Patrick Fitzpatrick and wife Catherine McNaughtan - appear to have originated from Tynan where they married in 1857 where witnesses to the event were Thomas McNatten and Henry Hughes. Their first 4 children, Thomas, John, James and Daniel, had their baptisms registered in the Tynan Catholic register, between 1858 and 1861. The next child Patrick's baptism is registered in the Monaghan parish (Co. Monaghan) register in 1863 so they had clearly moved from Tynan parish. The same year (1863), Patrick Fitzpatrick's business interests of miller, grocer and tavern keeper, are subject to bankruptcy and related proceedings (local newspapers - see report) and by 1865 the family appear to be living at Gateshead, Co. Durham, northern England where a daughter Catherine was baptized and who likely died in infancy. Their next 6 sons were born 1868-1879 in or near the area of the town of Leeds, England. A final child, Mary was born 1883 at Providence RI.

The family do not appear to have emigrated from Leeds all at once. The 1881 census shows Catherine Fitzpatrick (nee McNaughtan) with sons John, James, Daniel, Patrick, Joseph, Francis, Michael, Peter and 2 year old Edward (who would become Rev. Edward Fitzpatrick at Bar Harbor, Maine). Patrick Fitzpatrick, the father of the family, is absent from this census of April 1881, as is eldest son Thomas (b.1858) - possibly they were already at Providence, but further investigation required to clarify that. A passenger list of 24 April 1882 shows Catherine Fitzpatrick sailing from Liverpool to New York with 6 of her sons - James, Patrick, Francis, Michael, Peter and Edward. Sons John, Daniel and Joseph are not included in this listing so they either had already left England or did so at a later date. What is certain is that the entire family emigrated to Providence.

*Rev Edward Francis Fitzpatrick's various biographical and autobiographical records narrates that his father Patrick Fitzpatrick (b.c.1835-37 Co. Armagh) had served time in British jails and been flogged for his interests in the fight towards Ireland's independence. This obviously occurred at sometime prior to c.1882. The Fenian movement was heading to a peak in Ireland in the early to mid 1860s with 1867 being the year of a failed armed attempt at change. Possibly Patrick Fitzpatrick's time in prison related to this period or possibly to the period around 1881 when he is absent from the 1881 family census. Sometimes conditions were placed on released Fenians that they must leave Ireland for America. Much further research is possible here to establish just what was Patrick's involvement in these events and to which other family and extended family members did these interests relate.*

NOTES: I have not managed to trace living descendants and addresses in the usual way for this branch. Joseph E (b.1895) had no children to his wife Helen; Edward F (b.c.1897) was a Catholic priest (present at Rev. John F. McKearney's funeral as sub-deacon), I cannot find his death record or gravestone but a public member tree on Ancestry (see report) provides this as his date of death, with no source, thus my question mark. Charles F (b.1898) apparently had no children; the youngest son (by far), Francis C (b.1915) appears to have had children – but again this is taken from the said public member tree on Ancestry (see report) as is his wife's name and death date – three unnamed children are shown on that tree; the owner would need to message back to confirm the details etc. I have entered two surnames for the wife of Francis C (b.1915) as the public member tree gives a different one from that found in the Providence marriage index of 1941. Some of the PMTs on Ancestry can be very badly wrong – I used those which seemed most

*accurate – so verification needed here on this descendency of Francis Fitzpatrick (b.1870) via his youngest son Francis C (b.1915). My own research otherwise indicates that the other three brothers had no issue.*

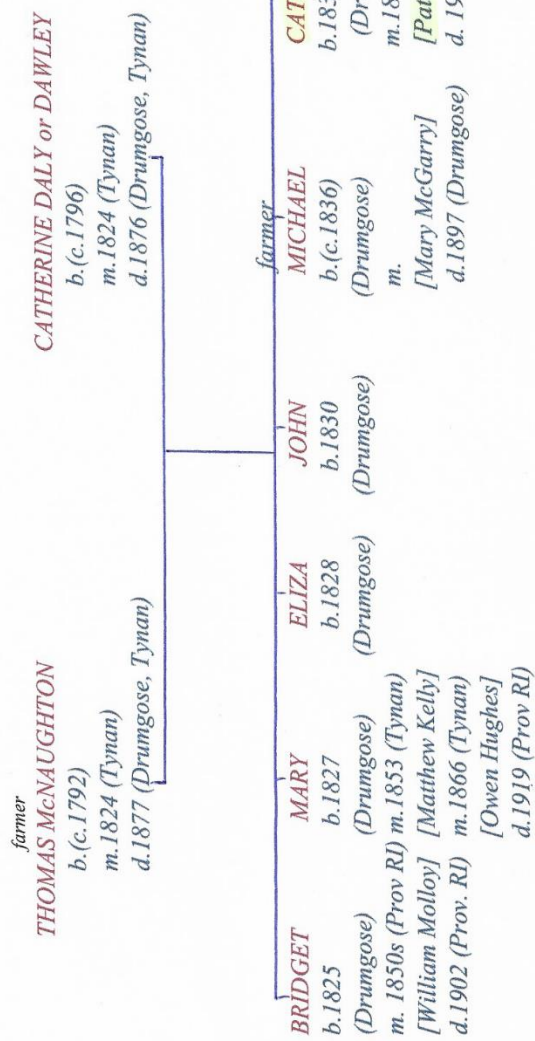

Notes: This descendency is taken from my research in records, plus what seems to be a reliable public member tree on Ancestry. It is from that PMT that James E Fitzpatrick (b.1897) is shown as having 3 children, two unnamed so possibly still living. The dates of death for Catherine, Edmund and Leo are likewise taken from that tree - so ideally, a message of reply would be helpful from the owner. Celena Marie's 2006 obituary certainly shows her as a

*daughter of Peter Fitzpatrick and Celene Morancy, so this is probably accurate. Edmund C (b.c.1902), a bus driver on the pre-1940 census, is shown to have been a corporal, US army, on his gravestone at St. Francis, Pawtucket.*



*Notes: The above chart shows the known children born to Thomas McNaughton and Catherine Dawley (Daly) at Drumgose townland, Tynan, closeby Crossdall, Sherries and Tullycomiskey (Clontibret) townlands, all which now feature in the wider ancestral story of Daniel McKearney and Ellen McNally.*

*See separate charts for the descendancy from the three McNaughton sisters above, all of whom ended up in Providence – Catherine's (b. 1839) Fitzpatrick children are known as 'cousins' to Rev. John F McKearney. See current report (cover lettered Nov. 2020) for greater detail and comment on where the said cousinship may lie – i.e. Ellen McNally (McKearney) (b.c. 1840) was the same age as Catherine McNaughton (Fitzpatrick). Were they cousins? Was Ellen McNally's mother (recorded as Margaret on her 1912 RI death record) a McNaughton or a Daly/Dawley? Additionally, Ellen McNally (McKearney) also actually lived at the same address, for a time, c. 1901, as Mary McNaughton (b. 1827) (Hughes), 26 Baxter Street, Providence.*



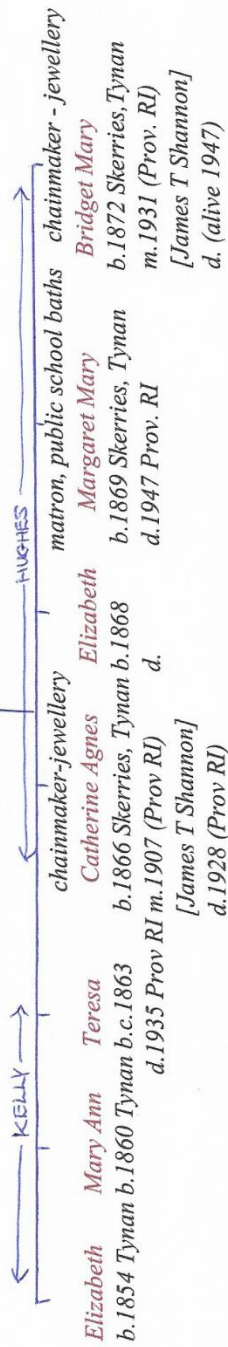

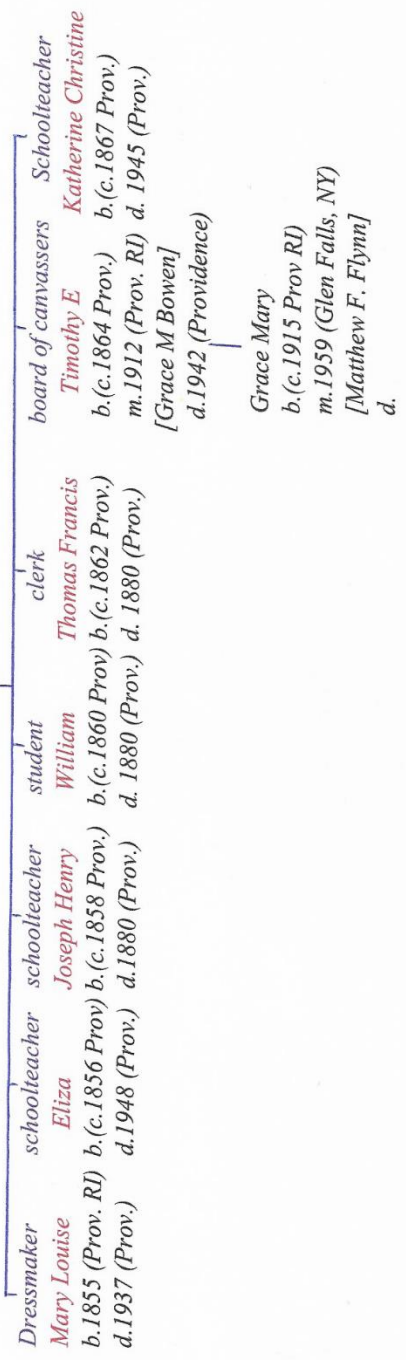
Notes: No living descendants found in this branch. This is not final, though as one child remains to be accounted for - census refers to Mary McNaughton having had 8 children, 4 living in 1900. Also the marriages/deaths of Elizabeth and Mary Ann Kelly, her daughters to her first marriage, have not yet been accounted for; one, Theresa, is found at Providence, having emigrated 1880s. By c. 1890, the family as found above (excluding the eldest Kelly daughters) are found at Providence; however, evidence shows that Mary McNaughton, husband Owen Hughes and daughter Catherine (b. 1866) appear to be on the 1901 at Skerries, Tynan, despite being found on the 1900 Providence census at 26 Baxter Street. They returned (though no passenger listings found) as Owen Hughes died at 28 Baxter, Providence in 1906. There is nothing found to show or even suggest that the family as found on the mentioned 1901 census at Skerries, Tynan is not them, however strangely the name 'Owen Hughes' as tenant is not scored out even in later valuation books checked, up to 1929 and no other of the name is accounted for locally in deaths. The 1911 census does not show them there despite the tenancy book never changing up to (at least) 1929. There is a note against the tenancy in 1908 referring to some unspecified change which may tie in with Owen Hughes' death in 1906 at Providence. It is definitely the family's original plot as, until 1868, when it changed to Owen Hughes as tenant, it was formerly held (from the earliest valuation of 1864) by 'Mary Kelly' which was Mary

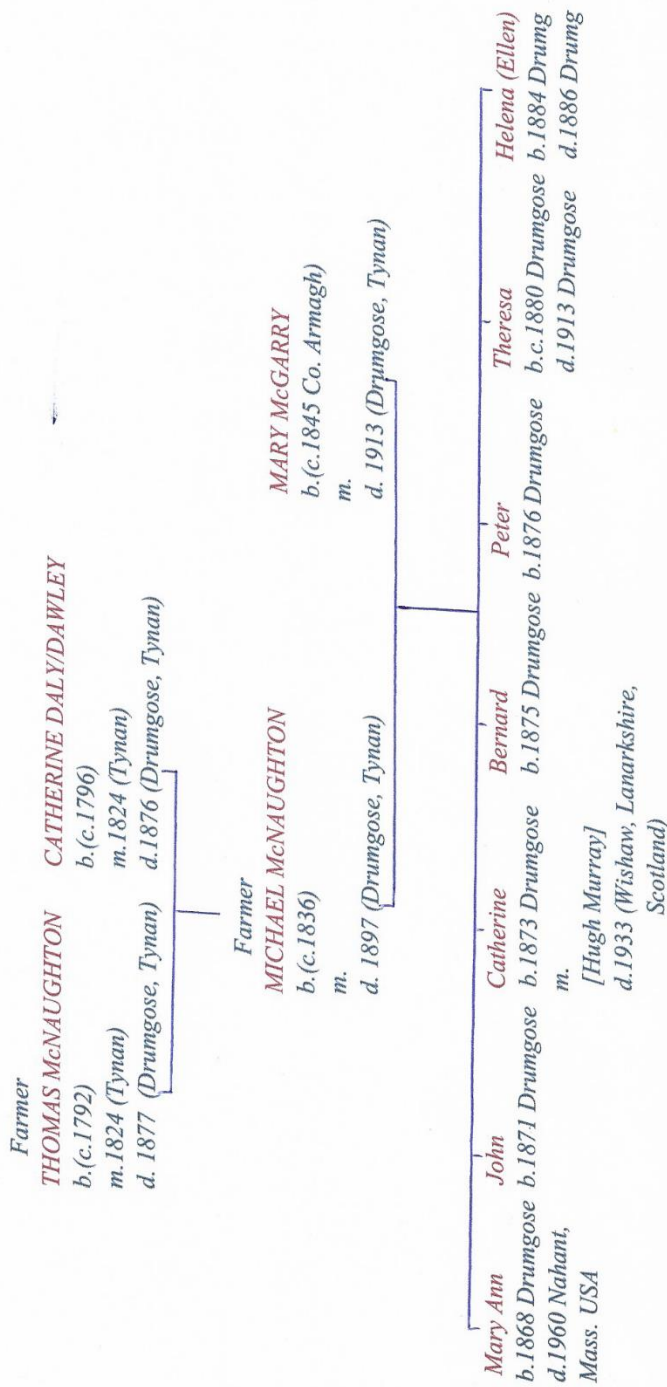
*McNaughton's (b. 1827) widowed surname, before re-marriage in 1866, to Owen Hughes. It would appear from the record evidence that somehow the plot was maintained by the emigrant family – with in later years someone else (a relative?) farming it, probably even purchasing it. Tracing this plot forwards in time through the Irish land purchase records would be interesting as any living relatives may be more inclined to know of the farm's history, involving original tenants who emigrated to Providence RI.*

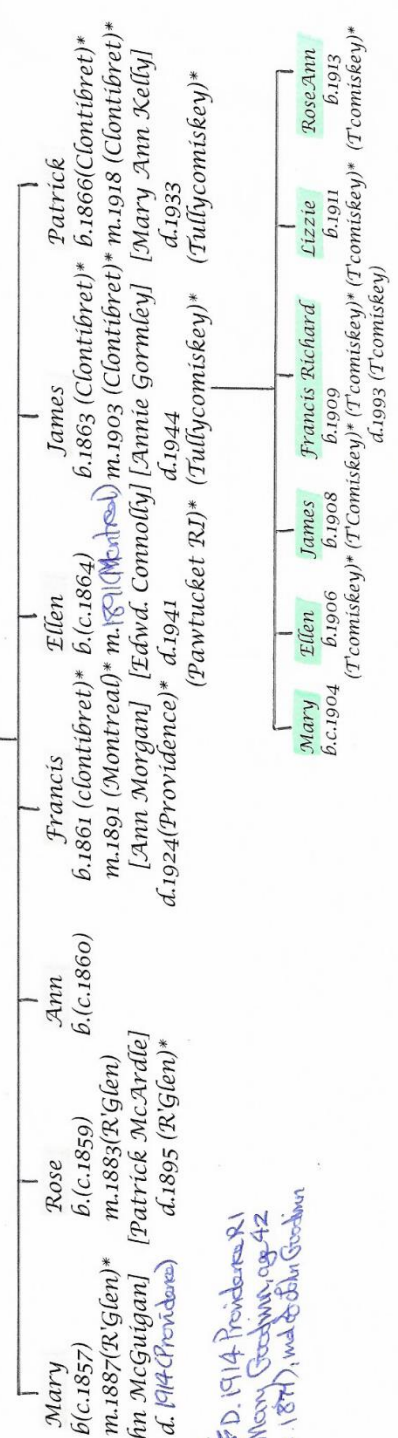
Notes: There may still be living descendants to find from this branch as it has not been fully investigated. The eldest, Mary Ann McNaughton (b.1868) died age 92 in Nahant, Mass, buried in the same churchyard where her cousin Rev. Edward F Fitzpatrick was priest at Bar Harbor, Maine, for many years. A newspaper obituary refers to her relationship to the said Rev. Fitzpatrick, this her father Michael McNaughton is placed above as a likely son to Thomas McNaughton & Catherine Dawley (Daly) who were Rev. Fitzpatrick's maternal grandparents (via his mother Catherine McNaughton b.1839 Drumgose, Tynan).

Notes: See also July 2019 report for full narrative of findings. The above family tree is that of the McNallys of Tullycomiskey townland, Clontibret parish, Co. Monaghan, which adjoins Drumgolat, where Nellie McKearney (Moyn) lived (ref. letters by her 1982-84) until her death in 2011. Drumgolat in turn borders Crossáil (Tynan, Co. Armagh) so Tullycomiskey is located very near to Crossáil. The chart above was able to be constructed entirely from the starting point of the clues left (via Nellie's 1980s letters) by the McNally brothers James (died 1908 above) and Francis Richard (b.1909 above) who were then in their early 70s. Their specific information on the death of their uncle Francis McNally (died 1924 Providence) was verified, allowing an opening into researching this family, whose members are also said to include (Ref. the said McNally brothers) a cousin Mary Roy and a great-aunt, Ellen McNally (McKearney) whose son became a priest, ordained in the USA (Rev. John F. McKearney). It was found that several members of this family also lived at Rutherglen before leaving for Providence RI, some (Francis b.1861) via Quebec; and further that their houses were next door to the McKearneys at Greenbank Street, Rutherglen. All of the above findings - the close proximity of Tullycomiskey to Crossáil; the Rutherglen connection; the Providence link are good evidences that this is the family of Ellen McNally (McKearney) (b.c.1840). Further research IS possible, including specifically to find more direct evidence that James McNally (b.1833) above is brother to Ellen McNally (McKearney) (b.c.1840). One item - a search forwards in time for living relatives in both Ireland and USA, may prove very useful in this respect in terms of recalled ancestral information that could then be used as research clues to access further original ancestral records, as has in fact been the case this stage of research with the family information recalled by the McNally brothers from c.1982.



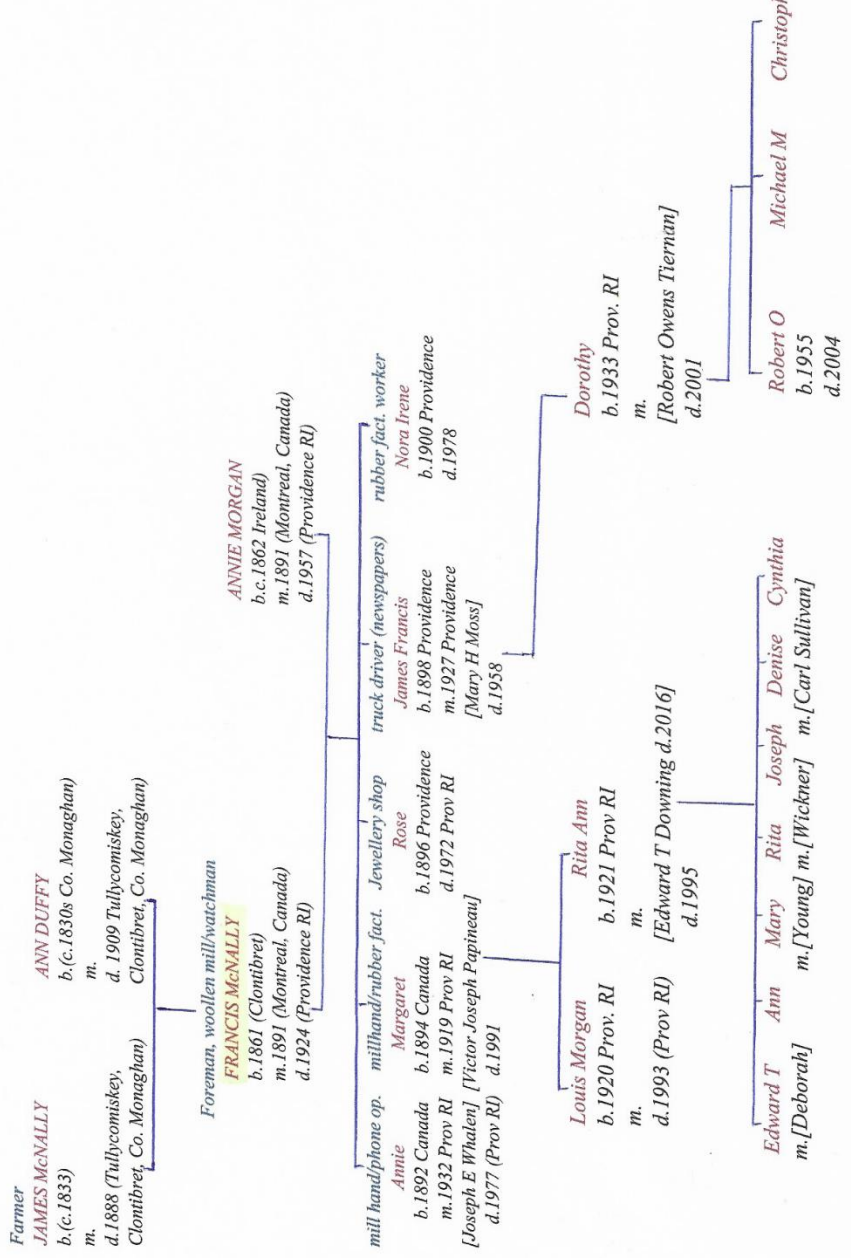
Further Notes on McNally of Tullycomiskey Townland family chart:

Given that James McNally (b.c.1833) is proposed as brother to Ellen McKearney (b.c.1840), the question is were the family at Tullycomiskey in James McNally's (b.c.33) childhood. Ellen McNally's (McKearney) father's name is recorded as Patrick McNally from her 1912 Providence RI death record, and her mother's name given as Margaret (the surname is not recorded). This is the only record source from which we have the names of Ellen's parents and further original sources would be good, especially any recording her mother's pre-married name - which for reasons covered in previous reports, is assumed to be Fitzpatrick. The 1830 Tithe record for Tullycomiskey lists a Patrick McNally, with just over 3 acres. This may be the father of Ellen but further research to obtain further original sources would be advisable for verification.

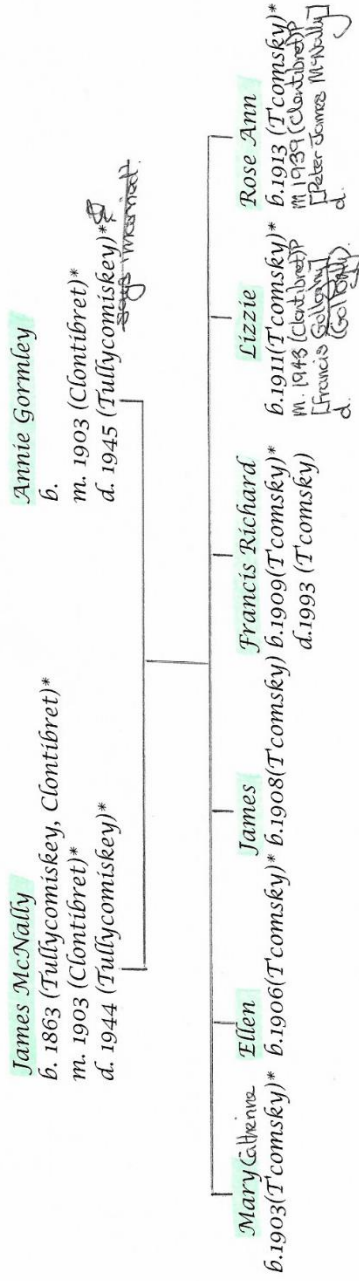
This McNally at Tullycomiskey family were certainly known to Ellen McNally (McKearney) for reasons covered in this current (July 2019) report.

Referring again to the McNally chart: Mary McNally (b.c.1857) lived at Rutherglen at the time of the 1881 census (in a house with siblings Francis (b.1861), Rose (b.c.1859) and Ann (b.c.1860). Like the McKearneys, they are not there as early as 1871 so perhaps arrived at Rutherglen around the same time as the McKearneys. The McNally's parents, James McNally (b.c.1833) (and proposed brother to Ellen McKearney) and his wife Ann Duffy were not at Rutherglen (or in Scotland) at time of the 1881 census and neither were their younger children - Patrick b.1866, James b.1863 and Ellen b.c.1864, who were likely at Tullycomiskey. Note also that various Irish records for the family refer to the spelling as McNally/McEnally/McInally. The Valuation Revision Books, similar to those used previously, for Tynan parish, which shows tenancies and dates of their changing hands, should be looked at for Clontarf but unlike the Co. Armagh versions which are online, the Co. Monaghan versions (along with those for all of the Irish Free State) are not online, although digitized but only accessible at Dublin.

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Farmer (at Tullycomiskey, Clontibret)



The above family shows Francis (b.1909) and James (b.1908) who were the McNaally brothers, neighbours to Nellie Moen, as per her 1980s letters. Their father James McNaally (b.1863 d.1944) remained at Tullycomiskey as did his brother Patrick (d.1933, no known children). Their siblings, Francis, Rose, Ellen, Mary and Ann variously left Ireland via Rutherglen to Providence RI (Francis, Ellen and Rose's children - Rose died 1895 Rutherglen). It is the above family who obviously maintained correspondence with their relatives in Providence RI (see other charts) and the above James and Francis recalled their uncle Francis McNaally, who they knew died 1924 Providence; and their cousin Mary Roy and great-aunt Ellen McNaally (McKearney) whose son was a priest, ordained in the USA.

There may be further research living relatives in Ireland of the above people. Whilst Francis and James did not marry and had no known children, at least two of their sisters married as Nellie Moen's letters refers to one of those as 'Mrs. Gallagher of Keady'; and the above Annie Gormley (McNaally)'s 1944 death record was registered by a grandson called Duffy.

A Further FITZPATRICK connection to the direct ancestral McKearneys - from previous research (2018), it was found that at the time of the 1891 Census, the above John (b.1864), Maria (b.1868) and Elizabeth (Lizzie) (b.1872) Hughes were living in the household of Daniel McKearney, wife Ellen McNally and family at Glasgow Road, Rutherglen. Research revealed that their mother, an Ellen Fitzpatrick, who had married Bernard Hughes in 1857 at Tynan, Co. Armagh, had just recently died at Dumbarton town, Dumbartonshire, Scotland, a few weeks before the time of the 1891 census. Her husband Bernard Hughes had died there in 1880.

At the point in research above noted (2018) the existence of the McKearneys' Fitzpatrick cousins at Providence RI was not yet known. It would seem a strong possibility that the three Hughes living with the McKearneys in 1891, were family of some sort. There are two points immediately noticeable to add to this assumption (apart from the fact that the family originated at Tynan as did the McKearneys): firstly, Ellen Fitzpatrick (Hughes) 1891 death record at Dumbarton, records her father as a Daniel Fitzpatrick, a Grain Miller. There were many times fewer men with specific trades in rural Ireland as compared to the bulk of small farmer/farm labourer population and so there would hardly be more than a few (or even more than one) Daniel Fitzpatrick, Grain Miller at that time in the Tynan/Monaghan area - given this there is a good likelihood that this man is the same Daniel Fitzpatrick, Miller, who is recorded as father to Patrick Fitzpatrick (b.c.1835-37) at Providence. Secondly, the 1857 marriage of the above Ellen Fitzpatrick to Bernard Hughes was witnessed by a Patrick Fitzpatrick; additionally, the marriage is immediately followed in the Tynan register by that of the said Patrick Fitzpatrick to Catherine McNaughtan, who we know are the McKearney cousins, and who emigrated to Providence RI.

Further research here is certainly possible to try to further better define the Fitzpatrick links to the McKearney ancestry. So far, I have not investigated whether the above Hughes family also went to Providence.
