### From the Pastor's Desk...

I can't help but reflect on where we were a year ago, October 2020...we had a small group that was putting together protocols for resuming in-person worship, training was held for volunteers willing to help with these worship protocols, a brief video was made so that folks knew what to expect when they returned for worship; we were readying ourselves in anticipation to resume in-person worship, with everyone's health and safety foremost in our mind. Now, October 2021, in-person worship and activities have resumed, with precautions still in place; we are intentionally and carefully moving forward. You will see in this newsletter, that we've had some recent special activities and are looking forward to more this month and in the months to come.

In remembrance of St. Francis of Assisi, whose commemoration is October 4, we offer this time of recognition to bless pets and animals, creatures Francis called his brothers and sisters. Please bring your animal on a leash or in a carrier to ensure the comfort and safety for all attendees.

**Reformation Sunday** is Sunday, October 31. It is the day we remember and celebrate Martin Luther's action of nailing his 95 Theses to the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, Germany on October 31, 1517. This action helped to spark what we know as the Reformation. You are encouraged to wear Red to worship this day, as it is the color of the day. We will have a time for cake and coffee following worship in the courtyard.

All Saints Sunday is Sunday, November 7. It is a day in which we honor and remember those who have been baptized and those who have died since All Saint's Sunday of last year. We will light candles on the baptismal font and the altar to commemorate this day. We are also going to add a slide show of pictures as part of our worship service, for those saints in our lives who have gone on before us. **Beer and Hymns** will be part of Bethlehem's 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration on Sunday, November 7. What is beer and hymns? Just as it sounds, an opportunity to have a beer and sing hymns. Beer and hymns has become a fun gathering for people to get together and enjoy a beverage if they wish, and the opportunity to sing hymns, from the classics to more contemporary. Some of the hymns written by Martin Luther were set to the tunes of popular tavern songs of his time. We will have beer, as well as non-alcoholic and root beer and have a hymn sing following our anniversary luncheon. The luncheon costs \$10 per person and includes a ticket for 1 beer for those over 21 years.

Bethlehem Lutheran continues to follow current **CDC guidelines** by recommending the wearing of face masks while gathered indoors at church (worship & fellowship). ### "Faithful Stewards of God's Infinite Grace"

"Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received" (1 Peter 4:10)

We are entering into our annual stewardship emphasis entitled, "Faithful Stewards of God's Infinite Grace." During the next few weeks, we will consider what it means to be a "faithful steward" and how our stewardship translates into practical Christianity.

This emphasis is built in its entirety on two concepts: First, God owns everything! As Psalm 24:1 states clearly, "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it." God owns it all and has never relinquished the title deed to the world. Second, our responsibility is to manage that which belongs to God which God has entrusted to us. In other words, all that we have is a blessing from God and represents that which God has loaned to us on a temporary basis.

What kinds of things belong to God? Certainly our time is a gift from our Heavenly Father that is given to everyone equally. All of us have the same amount of time — 24 hours per day. How we use our time is what makes the difference for this life and for eternity. Some will squander their time by giving priority to activities that carry little impact for eternity. Others will invest their time wisely for God's glory and for the good of others.

Our talents are also gifts on loan from God. Not everyone receives an equal amount of talents or abilities, but all of us can excel at something. Some are called to a public ministry whereby what they do is highly visible, including pastors, worship leaders and teachers. Others are called to a less visible role in the ministry and work of the church. But all of us are given talents and abilities which can be used for God's glory and to strengthen the Gospel outreach here at Bethlehem Lutheran Church.


The question is not whether we can do something for the Lord. The question is if we will use our talents and abilities to serve God. Unfortunately, many times, we offer excuses to avoid serving the Lord, excuses that often appear humorous when applied to other activities. Moody Monthly once carried an article which illustrated excuses people might use for not attending sports events. The analogy is easy to make in terms of serving the Lord.

Every time I went, they asked me for money. The people with whom I had to sit didn't seem very friendly. The seats were too hard and not comfortable. The coach never came to call on me. The referee made some decisions with which I could not agree. I was sitting with some hypocrites — they only came to see what others were wearing. Some games went into overtime, and I was late getting home. The band played numbers that I had never heard before. The games are scheduled when I want to do other things. My parents took me to too many games when I was growing up. Since I read a book on sports, I feel that I know more than the coaches anyhow. I don't want to take my children because I want them to choose for themselves which sport they like best.

On the second day of their conference at Yalta, Premier Stalin gave President Roosevelt a reason why a proposed plan would not work. Roosevelt gently reminded Stalin that this was not the same reason he had given the previous day. Stalin replied, "My dear Roosevelt, whenever you don't want to do something, one excuse is as good as another."

Stop and think about it: 80% of the work in most churches (including our church) is done by 20% of the people. The rest have made other activities a priority for their time and talents.

As one of the "Faithful Stewards of God's Infinite Grace" here at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, will you go against that trend by making a commitment to the "Proprietor of the Universe" to use the time and talents that have been given to you to make a difference in the ministry and outreach of our church? Remember, as one of those to whom God has entrusted time, talents and treasure, God is counting on you. . . .


