stop! While not sending forth ravens or doves, I must say I have delighted in the diversity of birds and butterflies that have made their appearance on the property as a result of the tall grasses, the weeds (wait – they did have flowers when they got really big!) the bugs and the worms.

Many days we went out looking for rainbows when the sun made an appearance and often saw one. One afternoon there was a double rainbow, but part of it was also replicating itself and could actually have been considered a triple! It was gorgeous!

Welcome to the newest Sister Susan!

Sr. Susan M. Leslie, OP, a native of Revere, MA, is the newest member of our staff. She comes to us with a variety of ministerial experiences in her background, from teaching high school religion to parish ministry, and from hospital ministry to over 12 years as a missionary in South America. Her bachelor's degree is in Religious Studies with a concentration in scripture. She has also done some graduate level studies in theology, scripture, and spirituality. Her master's degree is in Physical Therapy.

During her years in Peru, she received her training in Spiritual Direction through the Emmaus Program of Spiritual Accompaniment co-directed by a Dominican Sister from Argentina and a Benedictine Monk from Belgium. Her ministry in Peru was multi-faceted. She was the founder and director of a complementary medicine center in the Diocese of Chimbote that focused on giving personal treatments and teaching both individuals and groups some methods of holistic self-care with a particular focus on those living in poverty. As a member of the Pastoral Social of the Diocese (social action group) she was engaged in various outreach projects, such as prison ministry in the women's section of the local prison, and the annual diocesan social justice week. Sr. Susan served in leadership roles among Dominican Sisters in Latin America, as the President of the Federation of Dominican Sisters of Peru, and as a team member in the Confederation of Dominican Sisters of Latin America and the Caribbean. She has experience accompanying both men and women, religious and lay, as well as facilitating retreat experiences. She finds spiritual accompaniment and retreat work to be particularly rewarding because it gives her the opportunity to witness the Spirit's work in the lives of others as they seek to grow in their self-understanding and their relationship with God.

Sr. Susan will be a member of the retreat staff, and the coordinator of our 12-Step Programs and Retreats. Additionally, she will be available for ongoing Spiritual Direction. She is bilingual, so Spanish-speakers are welcome!


