The Romans' Road And the Plan of Salvation

In my lifetime I've had over 2,000 souls saved as a result of taking tracts to the subways and streets of a city. This is not to devalue the importance of door-knocking, which is essential for churches, but I found the public transit to be great field to harvest.

The greatest approach to winning a soul to Jesus, given to us by the Baptists, is the Romans Road in the KJV. This is a set of generally 5 verses to cite that introduce you to the books of Romans and Revelation with a Plan of Salvation. It is a very simple way to give the Gospel and it provides a launching point for any other supporting verses from the Bible. It is the most IMPORTANT message ever given from one man to another for it involves the eternity of your soul. It is also the greatest gift any man can return to God for his blessings and his goodness to us.

The important thing about the presentation of the Gospel is the fact that *everyone is a sinner*, including the listener. That sin will send a man to Hell. But the blood that Jesus shed on the cross is enough to forgive all that sin and save him from Hell. All he needs to do is *ask the Lord to save him*, believing in his heart.

The 5 verses to the right of the image here are the scriptures that compose a Romans Road. Alt-



hough some KJV scripture used may differ, the principles are still the same.

It has been said by those of old, "All roads lead to Rome." Likewise, the Love of God in the KJV leads a man, verse by verse, to Salvation from Hell.

The Romans' Road to Salvation:

Romans 3:23

For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God.

Romans 6:23a

For the wages of sin is death...

Revelation 20:15

Whosoever was not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the Lake of Fire.

Romans 6:23b

...but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Romans 10:13

For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.
