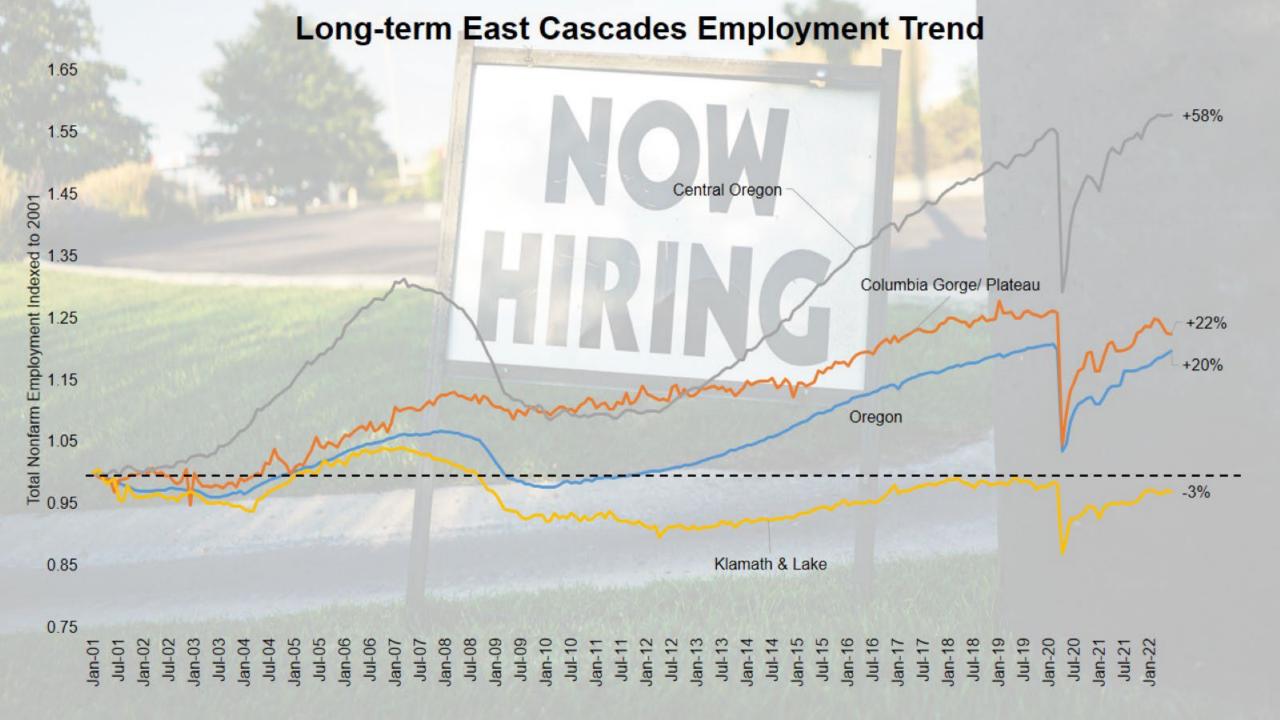
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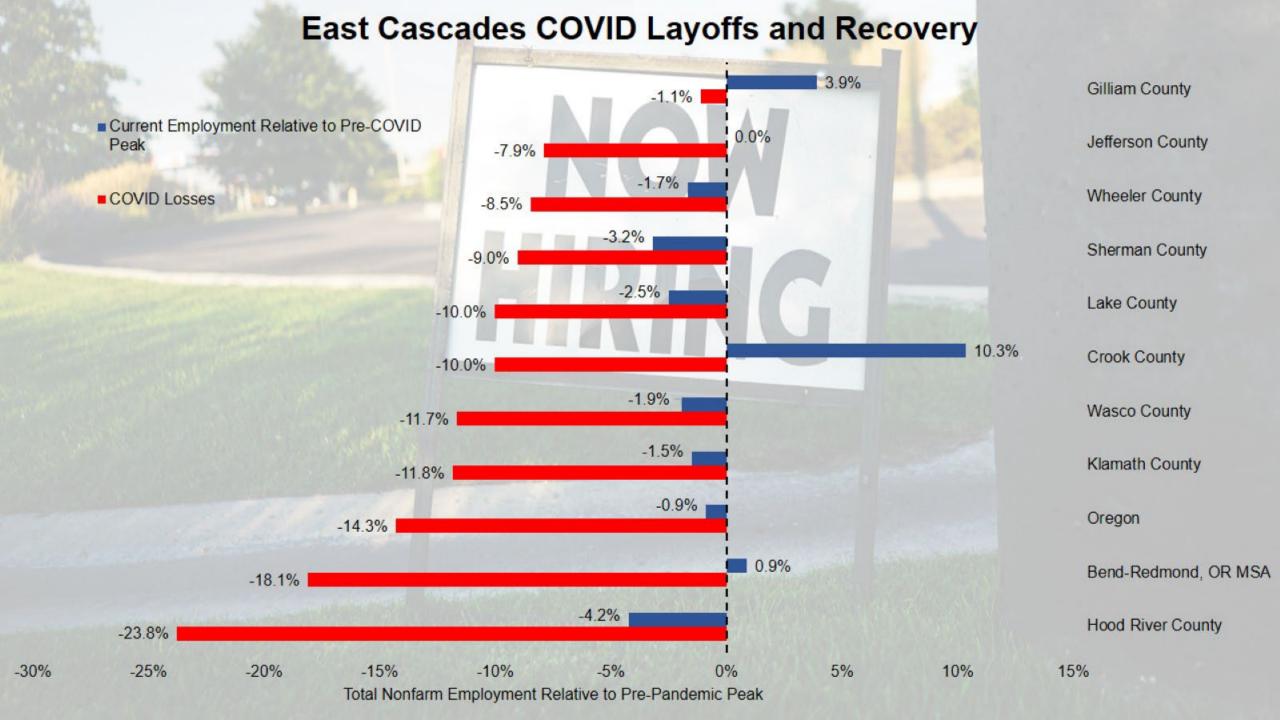


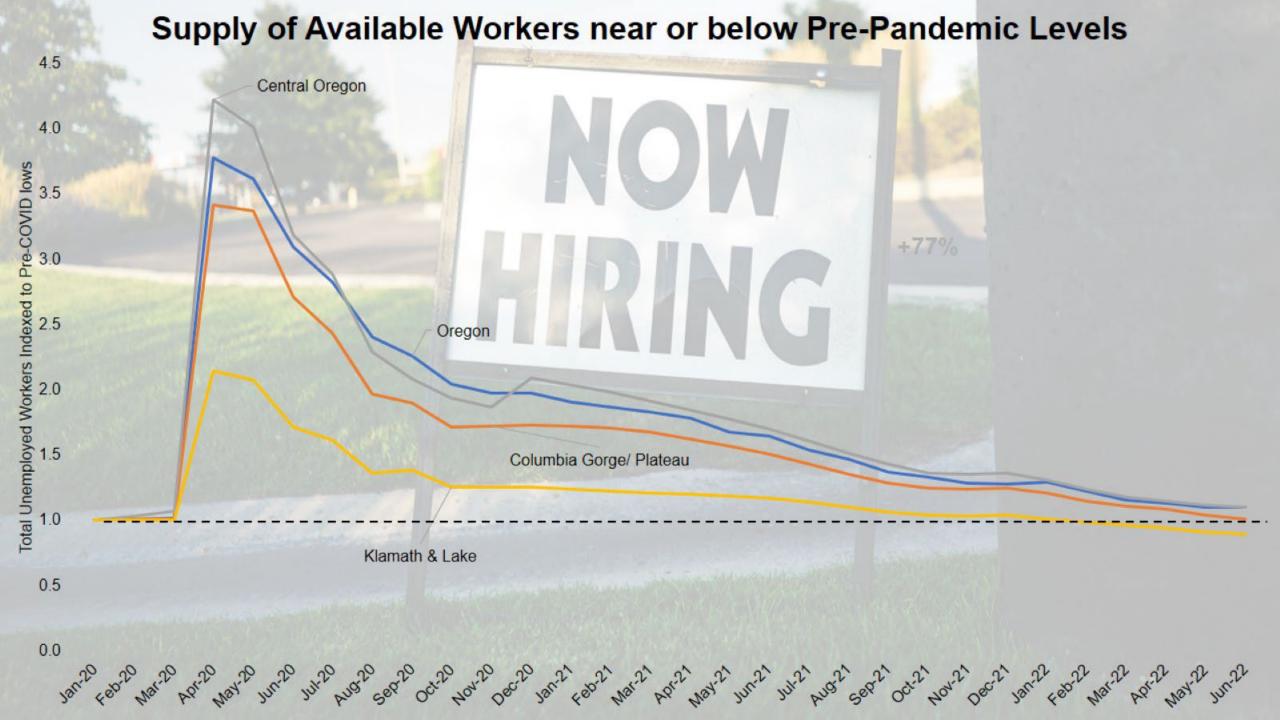
A Historically Tight Labor Market for East Cascades Communities



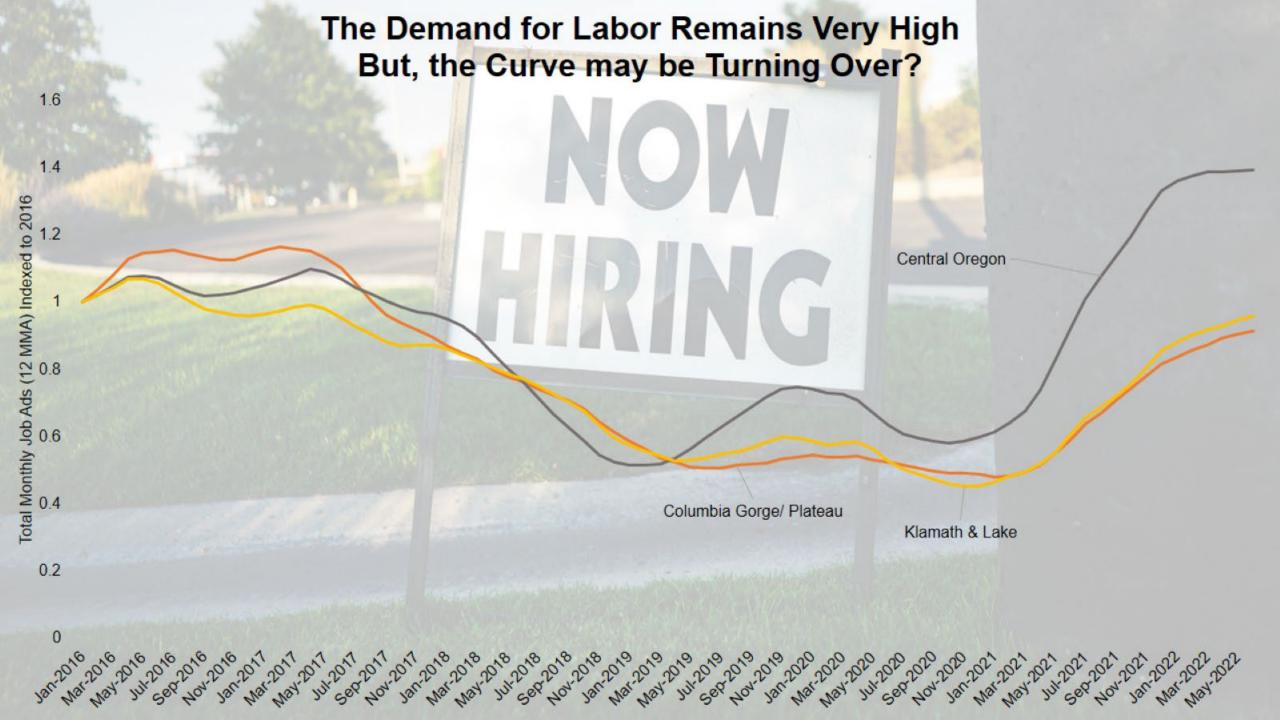

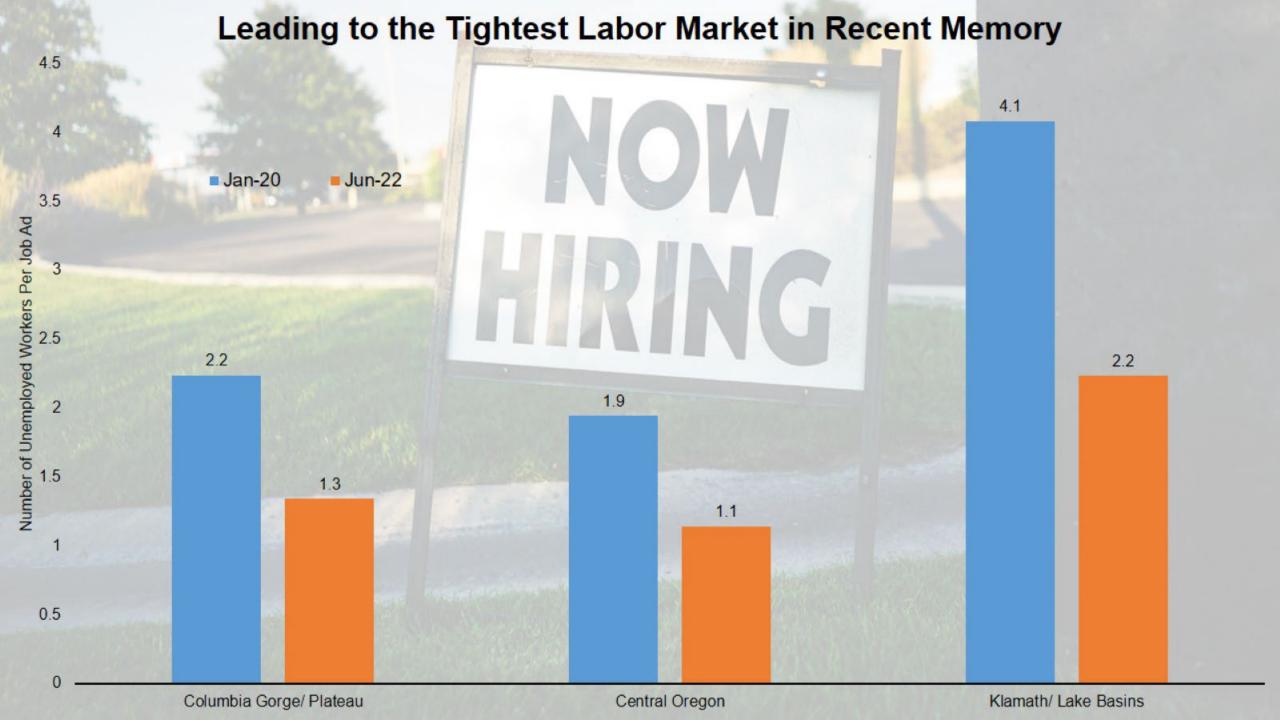












Tight Labor Market Resulted in Strong Wage Growth, but Inflation Eroded those Gains
