
Psalm 19 is worth reading and reflecting on as we ponder the glory of God and how we should review our days and think about the glory of God and the creation provided for us.



### Leadership Team (Ad Board) Report....

The devotions that began the September Leadership Team meeting were based on Matthew 20:20-28 and centered on the notion of "comparisons." We've all been compared with others, or we've compared others. Under almost any such circumstance, a person begins to think that if they haven't been, or can't be, on a par with someone else, it might not be worth trying to become "better." Then it gets to be an excuse to be less than we could be, or less than what God intends us to be. Consider, too, that "comparison" didn't do much for the mindsets of the disciples, who were hearing a woman essentially ask Jesus to make her sons His favored ones. Not surprisingly, the disciples grew angry with those young men for asking for special privileges. But Jesus knew how destructive comparisons like that could be, and, in His consummate mastery over human confusion, He said, simply, this – "Whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave." And He added, "Just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many". Those statements are the ultimate takeaway of this devotion - because, through it, we are reminded that God doesn't "play favorites", and that He doesn't wait to love us until we've reached a certain standard. We are *us*. He loves *us*. Not a hypothetical "us" – *US*. All, each, and regardless

### Lay Leader's Report

One thing a Lay leader can do for the people he represents is share his / her interesting Christian findings. In that spirit, here's a comparison of two versions of the close of 1 Corinthians 13, showing the interesting evolution of its language over the ages. The first is from a manuscript that Adam Clarke (early 19<sup>th</sup> century Bible commentator) claimed in his day to be the oldest English version of this Scripture in existence. Second is the same passage from today's New International Version.

<u>OE Verses 8-13</u>:- Forsothe of the party we ban knowen: and of partye prophecien. Forsothe whenne that schal cum to that is perfit: that thing that is of partye schal be avoydid. Whenne I was a litil chiilde: I spake as a litil chiilde. I understode as a litil chiilde: I thougte as a litil chiild. Forsothe whenne I was a maad a mam: I avoydid tho thingis that weren of a litil chiild. Forsothe we seen now bi a moror in dercness: thanne forsothe face to face. Nowe I know of partye: thanne forsothe I schal know and as I am knowen. Nowe forsothe dwellen feith hoope charite. These three: forsothe the more of hem is charite

<u>NIV Verses 8-13</u>: For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when completeness comes, what is in part disappears. When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known. And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

Charite. Charity. Love. Same thing. Think about it.


### Fire & Ice Campaign....


