COVID-19

The Department of Aging and Adult Services (DAAS) developed this informational flyer to report on the department’s response to the COVID-19 outbreak. Based on recommendations and guidance from state agencies including the California Department of Aging (CDA), DAAS continues to assess the needs of the community to ensure the health and safety of our residents and program participants while minimizing any disruption to service delivery.

As the designated Area Agency on Aging (AAA), DAAS places the health and safety of our residents and program participants at the highest level of importance. DAAS, in collaboration with contracted service providers, has implemented the following modifications to service delivery of the **Title III-E Family Caregiver Support Program until further notice:**

- Participants with scheduled visits are being contacted by telephone to screen for signs of illness. Participants have the option to accept or decline/postpone the service but screened for alternative back-up plan should participant be at risk.
