DESCRIPTION: Anderson Archery was one of the world's largest archery distribution retailers in the 1960's. They also contracted with select bow companies to make Anderson branded bows. This bow was made by Shakespeare and is a similar design to the 72-73 redesigned Necedah X-26. Nice looking and performing recurve. Bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Beveled arrow shelf. Overlays and tips are in great condition. No drilled holes; No chips, dings or cracks. No stress lines or crazing. A few minor scuffs and nicks here and there. There was considerable crazing on the limbs that needed to be removed, and I was not able to save the original stamped decals. There is one superficial 3" scratch in the lower face limb (see pic on last page). Overall, this is a really nice bow in excellent condition for its age.
