Amabel provided a land acknowledgement and discussed her recovery journey. Spoke about invisible disabilities and generational trauma. Kate discussed her journey of recovery and hope. Discussed that success is often related to safety. Provided insight into her own story of sobriety, and the issue regarding health workers having a higher rate of suicide. Robert discussed his issues with addiction and homelessness. Discussed difficulties in obtaining services in rural areas, as well as how service work and being of service to others can work to help heal ourselves. FYSPRT members asked questions and had discussion around the harm reduction model, using strength-based and non-harming conversations and language and the importance of not assuming that others haven’t been affected by addiction. Also talked about that “we shouldn’t “should” on people, that everyone has the right to find their path and the importance of doing with, not for, others.</p>

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	<p>-Non-emergency Medical Transportation (NEMT) concerns have been elevated to the Statewide FYSPRT twice in the last couple years. The YYACC/CYBHWG did write a statement of support that was submitted as part of their recommendations to legislature to show support for a funding request in the amount of approximately 8 million dollars to help resolve some of the NEMT challenges being experienced by youth and families as reported by regional FYSPRTs across Washington.</p> <p>Caregiver respite was added to the Medicaid Transformation Project which is a demonstration waiver that allows WA to create and continue to develop services that improve our behavioral health system. Michelle – Statewide FYSPRT Tri-lead and YYACC/CYBHWG member, has been meeting with the Health Care Authority around what the waiver will look like.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">Caregiver respite services are still not available statewide, they are working toward making it available throughout the state in 2025 by focusing on the developing the workforce and building up the program.State FYSPRT youth Tri-Lead and SPARK are working together to build a youth only space to discuss concerns and priorities for youth in each region, Carolyn at SPARK will be developing a flyer for individuals to send out throughout their regions.Each region discussed successes and challenges, lots of engagement and community outreach being done, as well as FYSPRT events for members and non-members. Still a struggle to get and keep families and youth involved (across the state) and not all FYSPRTs have WISe staff at meetings.Greater Columbia reports that we have given out a combination of 318 ammo lock boxes, medication lock bags and gun safes in our region in 2023. Also continue to distribute 988 stickers in English and Spanish.
