


## The Bear Facts

#### BHPCNS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Dear Parents,

The Board wishes to thank the many parents, staff, and BHPCNS friends who contributed to the first annual Building a Brighter Tomorrow Together campaign. The campaign raised \$13,680! Your generosity will allow the school to purchase new rugs for the classrooms, offer a spring training for the staff on supporting neuro-diversity in a preschool setting, and add close to \$4,500 to the school's scholarship fund.

Each year, the BHPCNS Executive Board meets with Mrs. Sobrino to review her performance. Parent input is a key component of our review process. The Executive Board will send out a link to an online survey assessing Mrs. Sobrino's performance towards the end of April. 

#### FREE CAR SEAT INSPECTION

# FREE CAR SEAT INSPECTION

59% of all car seats are installed incorrectly.

CAR SEAT Rear facing provides the best protection for a young child's spine. Rear face for a minimum of 2 years, ideally until the seat is outgrown.



CAR SEAT facing convertible seat facing 5 point harness.



When a child has outgrown their harnessed seat, is at least 5 years old, and mature enough to sit properly, move to a booster seat. Booster seat use reduces the risk of serious injury by



SEAT BELT

When a child is at least 10 years old and can pass the 5 step test (below) move to the seat belt alone.

A child can ride safely without a booster seat when you can say YES to ALL 5













Back against the vehicle seat

Knees bend at edge of seat

Lap belt on tops of thighs, not on belly

Shoulder belt between neck and shoulder

Sits properly. No slouching, no playing with seat belt, etc.

#### SUMMER CAMP IS FILLING UP FAST

Heigh-ho, Heigh-ho It's off to camp we go! This year Bradley Bear is going camping! In our first session (June 2-June 13), we will pitch tents, learn how to make fires, study wildlife, and eat lots and lots of smores. We will put our camping skills to use in the second session (June 16 - June 27) and visit several National Parks. Camp Registration has begun and is open to all children currently enrolled in our 2s' program and ages 3 through rising 1st graders. Friends, cousins, neighbors are welcome. Campers do not need to be currently enrolled BHPCNS students (with the exception of 2-year-olds). Current students who are not potty trained may attend camp for an additional \$85 fee. The camp application is on brightwheel. Spots are filling up fast.

#### CDC RECOMMENDED MILESTONES FOR CHILDREN

#### SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL

#### 2 YEARS-OLD

Notices when others are hurt or upset, like pausing or looking sad when someone is crying

Looks at your face to see how to react in a new situation

#### 3 YEARS-OLD

Calms down within 10 minutes after you leave her, like at a childcare drop off

Notices other children and joins them to play

#### 4 YEARS-OLD

Pretends to be something else during play (teacher, superhero, dog)

Asks to go play with children if none are around

Comforts others who are hurt or sad, like hugging a crying friend

Avoids danger, like not jumping from tall heights at the playground

Likes to be a "helper"

Changes behavior based on where she is (place of worship, library, playground

#### MOVEMENT/PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

#### 2 YEARS-OLD

Kicks a ball

Runs

Walks (not climbs) up a few stairs with or without help

Eats with a spoon

#### 3 YEARS-OLD

Strings items together, like large beads or macaroni

Puts on some clothes by himself, like loose pants or a jacket

Uses a fork

#### 4 YEARS-OLD

Catches a large ball most of the time

Serves herself food or pours water, with adult supervision

\_\_\_ Unbuttons some buttons

Holds crayon or pencil between fingers and thumb (not a fist)

#### LANGUAGE/COMMUNICATION

#### 2 YEARS-OLD

Points to things in a book when you ask, like "Where is the bear?"

Says at least two words together, like "More milk."

Points to at least two body parts when you ask him to show you

Uses more gestures than just waving and pointing, like blowing a kiss or nodding yes

#### 3 YEARS-OLD

Talks with you in conversation using at least two back-and-forth exchanges

Asks "who," "what," "where," or "why" questions, like "Where is mommy/daddy?"

Says what action is happening in a picture or book when asked, like "running," "eating," or "playing"

Says first name, when asked

Talks well enough for others to understand, most of the time

#### 4 YEARS-OLD

Says sentences with four or more words

Says some words from a song, story, or nursery rhyme"

Talks about at least one thing that happened during his day, like "I played soccer."

Answers simple questions like "What is a coat for?" or "What is a crayon for?"

#### **COGNITIVE**

#### 2 YEARS-OLD

Holds something in one hand while using the other hand; for example, holding a container and taking the lid off

Tries to use switches, knobs, or buttons on a toy

Plays with more than one toy at the same time, like putting toy food on a toy plate

#### 3 YEARS-OLD

Draws a circle, when you show him how

Avoids touching hot objects, like a stove, when you warn her

#### 4 YEARS-OLD

Names a few colors of items

Tells what comes next in a well-known story

Draws a person with three or more body parts



#### OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY SCREENINGS

April 28th, 29th, and 30th for all ages



Developmental milestones are things most children (75% or more) can do by a specified age. Now is a great time to revisit your child's progress over the course of this school year. After reviewing the checklist from the CDC, please consult with your child's teacher on areas in which your son/daughter excels and areas he/she may need additional support. We have scheduled FREE occupational therapy screenings for mid April. Should you wish to recommend your child for a screening, just let your teacher or Liz know. Parents will receive a letter in advance of the screening with additional details and a permission slip. We need the permission slip to be signed and returned in advance of the screenings.

#### KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

#### MCPS Kindergarten Registration has begun!

MCPS elementary schools need to know if your child will be attending their school in September. To register your child, call your local elementary school. It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending in the fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until September the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall.

Transportation Days will soon be here. The BHPCNS Library has many books about cars and trucks. Check out these books that also touch on feelings, generosity, and different modes of transportation.

Room for Everyone by Naaz Khan - There is room for everyone and all their possessions (including 6 stinky chickens) on the little daladala (bus) in Zanzibar. A counting book with beautiful illustrations and rhyming text.







#### SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

#### ART (all ages) with Mrs. Mac 'N Cheese



There's something magical about turning a simple square of paper into a 3D object. Origami, the Japanese art of folding paper, is practiced by people of all ages around the globe. While many Origami projects can be intricate and challenging, there are also plenty of easy origami projects for kids to try. Our 2 & 3 year-olds will fold and decorate hats; Pre-K students will fold boats. Origami teaches kids:

- Focus
- Patience
- Attention skills
- Recall skills (when re-creating pieces from memory)
- Hand-eye coordination
- Fine motor skills

#### SCIENCE with Mrs. Mac 'N' Cheese

In March, each class planted tomatoes and flower seeds. They have been watering and watching these seedlings sprout and grow. In April, each class will transplant these seedlings into our Children's Garden. We will talk about everything plants and flowers need to grow and how spring weather creates the perfect conditions for this.

#### MUSIC (3-year-old & Pre-K) with Little Hands



In April, Little Hands Music will still make some "rainy music" and then move on to a theme called "Play Time" - all about spinning tops, Teddy Bears, and some "Cat and Mouse" songs and games!

We'll explore play activities this month, focusing on the concepts of high and low with The Duke of York and Jack-in-the-boxes, as well as fast and slow with cats and mice. Children will play with a wide variety of small percussion instruments, and explore movement concepts with hoops and streamers. We'll also make up some fun animal rhymes with the song "Once I Saw Three Cats" (and they were wearing hats!)
