Mary C. Kolar, 94, of Ubly died Sunday, Nov. 19, 2000, at Sparrow Hospital in Lansing. She was born May 29, 1906, in Ashland, Wisc., daughter of the late John and Rosa (Schmidt) Hund, Sr. Miss Hund married Albert Kolar on Nov. 18, 1933, in St. Ignatius Catholic Church, Freiburg.
