Alexander Robert Fligger, 78, of Bad Axe, passed away Thursday, January 13, 2005, at his residence of an apparent heart attack. He was born September 17, 1926 in Detroit to the late Alexander and Virginia (Grifka) Fligger. He never married. He attended the Martin Country School in Verona and went on to graduate from Ubyly High School in 1944. He served in the U.S. Army from January 1946 to April 1947. He had been employed at Pontiac Motors for 34 years when he retired in 1982. He was a member of the Bad Axe Senior Citizens Group and the GM Retirees Group.
