



As important that the prayer vigil is to us, your safety is also important.



Thank you so very much for your financial donation of \$409.00 to the ministries at Holy Trinity. Our Soup & Pasta Kitchen, Clothes Closet and Food Ministry are only able to continue to provide for the people of this neighborhood due to the generous hearts of people such as yourselves.

The Soup & Pasta Kitchen served over 8,540 meals and the Food Ministry distributed 1,417 bags of prepared food in 2024. With your support we are able to continue serving in God's ministry to help feed body and spirit with a good meal and fellowship.

With the Soup/Pasta Kitchen now reopened and serving meals Tuesday evening dinner and lunch on Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday, and distribution of rescued prepared food bags on Tuesday evenings we continue to serve people in need. Soon we will opening our "Laundry of Love", a free laundromat for our neighbors and friends. We will also be offering the opportunity to take care of some personal hygiene concerns while at the laundromat, providing soap, shampoo and linens, and using the shower rooms providing;

RECYCLING WITH A PURPOSE



Is your community or organization interested in removing plastic waste from the environment AND receiving a beautiful park bench for your efforts? Here is an opportunity that has been successful in several counties in our Synod.

"Trex® is proud to sponsor local recycling programs in communities throughout the country. For example, for K-12 schools, civic organizations, houses of worship and university organizations etc. If your team can collect more than 1,000 pounds of soft film plastics and packaging in a 12-month span, we will award a Trex® furniture bench to your organization." (www.trex.com) Trex is a company that manufactures composite decking and furniture. This recycling program encourages groups to collect plastic such as: pallet wrap, case overlap (i.e., water bottles), produce bags, bubble wrap, and lots more. The items must be clean, dry and free of food residue. At Trex, Sustainability is not just a buzzword-it's a founding principle of our company and part of our DNA. For more than three decades, we have continued to derive value from discarded materials, diverting waste from landfills and waterways. Our composite decking is made from 95% recycled materials, so recycling plays a considerable role in our day-to-day operations." Bryan Fairbanks, President and CEO of Trex® Company.

Participation is SO easy...sign up at https://nextrex.com/view/recyclingchallenge. You will receive helpful ideas, print-outs and other suggestions to make this project an easy one. Better yet, there are local groceries/stores (Tops, Wegman's, Giant Eagle, Kohl's and more) that provide collection points for your plastic, and provide weighing information. Once your organization is enrolled, you will need to collect 1,000 pounds of plastic within a 12-month period to be eligible for a park bench. Some of the organizations have cooperation agreements with dollar stores, etc., which allows the plastic to accumulate quickly.

If you know of other recycling opportunities, please share them with the Green Team so that we can share it as we care for our creation.

The Green Team's purpose is to "raise awareness of and advocate for the care of creation."

Develop a heart of generosity

Remember the words of the Lord Jesus, for he himself said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

Acts 20:35b

A friend who regularly volunteers to serve meals to the needy illustrates the truth behind Jesus' teaching.

"It's so rewarding to help," she says, explaining that the time and hard work is worth it. "I think get more out of it than they do."

When we give generously, it is often we who are blessed. But more than just enjoying a pleasant emotion, the act of giving truly blesses us by shaping our personalities and developing our character. That's a truth affirmed by research. (Check out "The Science of Generosity" white paper from the University of California at Berkeley, or The Science of Generosity Initiative at Notre Dame University!)

Generous people tend to be the kind of good folk we want as friends and neighbors. And they frequently are generous not only with their money but also their time, their love and their very selves. In other words, they are not merely generous, they are *generous-hearted*.

Anyone can develop a generous heart, or a *more* generous heart. Begin by deepening your relationship with God by seeking guidance and wisdom in daily prayer. Then simply begin to pour yourself out for the sake of others, giving generously as a spiritual exercise and discipline. Here are four ideas that won't cost you a dime:

Give a smile. Smile at everyone you see. You may be surprised at how it changes your mood.


Give a nice thought. Say something nice to everyone – family and friends, coworkers, parishioners, store clerks, folks in an elevator.

Give a courtesy. Hold a door open for the person behind you; at the grocery, let someone with just one or two items go ahead of you; stop for pedestrians.

Give your time. Find ways to serve people face-to-face: tutor schoolchildren, serve community meals, visit your church's shut-ins, teach ESL, volunteer at a homeless shelter.

Jesus said it is more blessed to give than receive. When we give our time, talents

and possessions, God blesses us by developing in us a generous heart.



What's the Difference Between Prayer and Intercession?

Prayer can be for yourself or anybody else. But praying for someone else would be called *intercession*.

In other words, you would pray without interceding when you're just talking to God about yourself, your own life, or about Him—in worship, thanksgiving, and adoration. But intercession can begin to happen when you move past that and start to pray for God's will to be done in someone else's life.

The difference between prayer and intercession doesn't stop there, though, because:

But intercession IS spiritually violent.

Intercession is forceful. The actual definition of intercession in the Hebrew (Biblical) language is "to impinge, by accident or violence or by importunity."*

Intercession brings one thing into violent contact with another thing so hard that it makes an impression.

What's the "one thing" that does the contacting? You.

And what (or who) are you contacting? God.

What kind of an impression—or mark—are you trying to make? Simple! You're trying to get His will done here on earth—in a situation, in another person, or in yourself.

So the actual definition of the word "intercession," in modern English, is:

- To collide with God violently until His will is enforced on the earth.
- To stand in the gap between God and man—as a priest between Heaven and earth—and say, "Father God, Your Kingdom come! Your will be done on earth as it is in Heaven!" ... and Continuing to do so until you see the results you know God desires on the earth.

Happy Father's Day!!!

Celebrate Father's Day and all fathers with these Bible verses about being a godly dad and husband. These passages of Scripture declare what God intended for men and how we can celebrate our fathers.

Exodus 20:12 ~ "Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you."

<u>Psalm 103:13</u> ~ *As a father shows compassion to his children, so the Lord shows compassion to those who fear him.*

Ephesians 6:4 ~ Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

<u>Proverbs 3:11-12</u> \sim My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline or be weary of his reproof, for the Lord reproves him whom he loves, as a father the son in whom he delights.

<u>Colossians 3:21</u> ~ Fathers, do not provoke your children, lest they become discouraged.

<u>Proverbs 22:6</u> ~ *Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it.*

<u>Proverbs 23:24</u> ~ The father of the righteous will greatly rejoice; he who fathers a wise son will be glad in him.

SEA ISLAND WINGS

Ingredients:

Hot Sauce:

1 cup hot sauce 1/2 cup molasses 4 tbs butter

Wings:

2 tbs light brown sugar

1 tbs salt

2 tsp garlic powder

2 tsp smoked paprika

2 tsps. Black pepper

2/4 cup olive oil (plus extra for oiling the grail)

3 pounds whole chicken wings

1/2 cup thinly sliced scallions, optional


2 tbs chopped fresh parsley, optional



- 1. Preheat a grill or grill pan at medium-high heat.
- 2. For the hot sauce: Mix together the hot sauce, molasses and butter in a small pot. Heat until combined, then set aside.
- 3. For the wings: Whisk together the brown sugar, salt, garlic powder, smoked paprika and pepper in a bowl. Whisk the oil into the dry mixture, creating a loose rub. Set a quarter of the mixture aside to use for brushing.
- 4. Slather the wings with the rub. Brush the grill grates with a little olive oil, then add the wings to the grill. Cook, covered, for about 10 minutes, then baste with the reserved rub mixture. Flip and baste with any remaining rub and cook for another 15 minutes. Remove the wings from the grill and toss with the hot sauce in a large bowl. Transfer to a platter and sprinkle with the scallions and parsley, if using.
