SustainableEHC to open Nature Trail July 14

SustainableEHC, the city's green team, will hold a ribbon cutting ceremony 4 p.m. Friday, July 14 to open the newly enhanced Nature Trail at City Lake Park, which includes the beautiful Mountain Laurel Loop.

Improvements to the existing trail were funded with a \$5,000 stewardship grant from Sustainable Jersey and Atlantic City Electric. It is the third grant the city has received for improvements at city parks. Prior awards include a \$10,000 resiliency grant to reinforce the bulkhead at the lake and a \$5,000 stewardship grant to identify tree species at Lincoln Park.

"We are grateful to our funders at Sustainable Jersey and Atlantic City Electric, who have made these projects possible," SustainableEHC Chairwoman Nanette LoBiondo Galloway said. "Together we are working to make Egg Harbor City a great place to live, work and play, all while protecting the environment."



SustainableEHC member Michael Sheridan, an avid outdoor enthusiast, proposed marking the trail for hikers as a way to attract more visitors to City Lake Park and to support the business community. He and the green team worked with Public Works employees, students at Cedar Creek High School and local vendors to develop the signage and install the trail head kiosk. Schairer Bros. Sawmill manufactured benches from several large oak trees that were felled by a nearby property owner. Resident Dave Williams manufactured several directional signs in his home workshop.

Residents and lake visitors are invited to attend the ceremony, which will include a tour of the 1.5-mile trail and information about the flora and fauna at City Lake Park.
