Effective July 22, 2026, Dues will increase to:

Individual 1 year - \$40.00,
Individual 2 year - \$60.00 &
Individual 3 year - \$80.00

Family 1 year - \$45.00, Family 2 year - \$70.00 & Family 3 year - \$95.00

I know we all hate to see this, but you can save a little money now by renewing before the increase takes effect. You can simply log into the EWMA app or web page at WWW.EWMA-

World.org and renew for up to 3 years at the current rate! I did and saved 30 bucks! If you are more than 365 days from renewal, you will not see the renew option, but that doesn't mean you can't get it done. Simply contact your Chapter Director or any Florida District Team member and we can do it for you, you can also call the Region A Director, Danny Baker or the Chief Technology Officer, Mike Melton. Any of us will be happy to assist you, but act fast, because July 22nd will be here before you know it!

Speaking of the EWMA website... Have you logged in lately? Have you ever logged in? I ask this, because I'm surprised at the number of members who rarely do and even more shocked at how many of our members have NEVER logged in... EVER! Why does this matter? THE STORY OF THE THREE BEARS

(Not encountered by Goldilocks)

You should always be familiar with the types of animals you might encounter in the areas you will be riding, especially when you travel into areas you do not normally travel. In August of 2023, I and another EWMA Member took a ride to the Arctic Circle in Alaska. We were aware of what type of wildlife we might encounter. One of the main characters was the bear. We did bring bear spray with us, and I mounted mine on the front crash bar of my Kawasaki Versys 1000 Adventure Bike for quick access in case I needed it. My first encounter was with a brown

bear who was traveling along the side of a straightaway. I saw he was getting ready to cross the road, so I stopped and let him cross. I was ready to make a quick U-turn should he have gotten any closer to me, but he kept a safe enough distance from me (about 20 ft). On another day of the trip as I rounded a curve there was a black bear crossing in front of me. I again came to an abrupt stop and waited for him to cross. Two bears in one trip. I have been riding motorcycles for about 58 years and that was my first encounter with bears.

Last week I went to ride the Dragon's Tail once again. I have been going there since 1975 and never came across a bear. As I was rounding a curve, there he was crossing in front of me. A large black bear. I have seen bears in Cades Cove, TN., but never on the Tail of the Dragon. Too bad it was in between photographers so there was no photo proof. My friend Jeff was riding behind me, and he did see the whole thing. I straightened up and came to an abrupt stop. Waited until the bear cleared the roadway and

then continued down the Tail to the next photographer. I got my photos which is what I always like to get when I ride the Dragon.

So that is my Three Bear Story. That is enough bear encounters to last a lifetime. They made good memories which is what riding is supposed to be all about. You should always be ready to encounter all types of wildlife when you ride and know how to quickly and safely stop or swerve as necessary to avoid hitting any animal.

I was thinking about over the years the types of animals I have come across on my travels. Here is a list of some of the critters I have seen: Moose, Bison, Elk, Mule Deer, Deer, Dogs, Cats, Mice, Rats, Squirrels, Chipmunks, Prairie Dogs, Armadillos, Possum, Turtles, Snakes, Frogs, Lizards, Alligators, Panthers, Bobcats, Eagles, Hawks, Seagulls, Crows, Buzzards, Pelicans, Cranes, Beavers, Otters, Ducks, Horses, Cows, Goats, Donkeys, Pigs and Turkeys just to name a few.

How Do I Get Logged In?

1. When you joined, you were sent an email with log-in information to get you started. Once logged in, you could then personalize your log-in and password.
2. It is recommended that once you log in, have it saved so you can easily get in the next time.
3. If you missed or do not have the invitation:

Contact the EWMA Technology Team (technology@ewma-world.org) or 843-847-1444) and they will get your user name and a temporary password sent to you. (After you log in with this new information, it is highly recommended that you update your password to something easy for you to remember). After clicking the "Login" link, a screen will appear for you to enter your username and password. To save

worrying about remembering your username and password in the future, after entering your username and password, if you click the square box next to the statement "Remember this device", in the future, when you go to the weblink, it will automatically log you in. Not everyone selects this option, but it does make it easier for you in the future. To get into your "Profile" section of the website, hover the cursor over your name in the upper right corner of the screen, and a dropdown box will appear.

Once in your new web page, take time to click on the different tabs and subjects in the dropdown boxes to discover all information and help that is available.

If you need help, talk with your Chapter Director or contact a member of the Florida District Staff.

Group Riding with No Electronic Communications – Part 1

The decline of CB radios and incompatibility issues between diverse electronic communication systems might lead to a group riding situation with no electronic communication at all, i.e., visual signals only. Visual signals include the standard hand signals and other signaling methods as described below.

Group ride communications with visual signals from leader-to-rider, front-to-back are relatively easy. On the other hand, rider-to-leader, back-to-front communications are problematic. Some of you may have already solved this problem with your groups. If so, I welcome your written comments. I hope I'm not trying to reinvent the wheel.

In collaboration with probably the most qualified group leader in the Florida EWMA, Dominick

DeSiato, here are some considerations (even "rules" maybe) for the group ride using visual signals only.

Ops normal-group ride-visual signals only:

1. The leader:
 - a. Communicates to the group with hand signals. See Hand Signals document on the national EWMA website, and the Motorcycle Safety Foundation's (MSF) Motorcycle Operator Manual, pages 52 and 53.
 - b. Increases attention to rider spacing, being alert for abnormally large spacing.
2. Each rider/co-rider:
 - a. Passes all hand signals to the rider behind. No exceptions! Hand signals for turns should be augmented with turn signal lights when able.
 - b. Maintains the briefed standard spacing, give or take temporary deviations.
 - c. Monitors the rider(s) behind, being especially alert for abnormally large spacing.

Unplanned stops-group ride-visual signals only:

1. The leader:
 - a. Interprets increased rider spacing as the primary visual signal that an unplanned stop is required.
 - b. Finds a safe location for the group to pull over and stop.

2. The "issue rider:" i.e., any rider encountering a personal or bike issue requiring an unplanned stop:
 - a. Employs "ride your own ride" concepts.
 - b. Pulls over and stops at a safe location.
 - c. Signals the "you lead/come" hand signal to the following rider(s).
3. Riders behind the issue rider:
 - a. Do not pull over or stop.
 - b. Continue with the group ahead.
 - c. Preserve the gap created by the issue rider's exit.
4. Riders in front of the issue rider:
 - a. Do not pull over or stop.
 - b. Increase spacing.
5. The gunner (only):
 - a. Stops to investigate the issue rider's issue. 12
 - b. Rides forward to meet with the stopped leader to formulate a plan of action for the group.
 - c. Passes the entire underway group to catch up to the leader to resolve a more serious situation requiring immediate action.

Whew! Takes a lot of words to describe a relatively simple procedure! Let me know your thoughts. Part 2 to follow.
