

A. J. Finn is the pseudonym of Daniel Mallory, currently a senior publishing executive at William Morrow/Harper Collins. An Oxford graduate and former book critic, he lives in New York City. His debut novel, The Woman in the Window, a psychological thriller reminiscent of Alfred Hitchcock's work, is being published simultaneously in 36 languages and is currently in development as a major motion picture at Fox. In an autobiographical statement, Mallory writes that he has for years struggled with depression. It is an experience, he writes, that "informs, in part, my debut novel and its traumatized heroine."

# Kristin Hannah

Kristin Hannah is an award-winning and bestselling author of more than 20 novels, including the international blockbuster The Nightingale, as well as Winter Garden, Night Road, and Firefly Lane. The Nightingale has been published in 43 languages and is currently in movie production at TriStar Pictures with an August 2018 release date. Home Front has been optioned by the film production company 1492 Pictures, founded by director Chris Columbus, which produced the Oscar-nominated movie The Help. Her newest novel, The Great Alone, has also been optioned for film. Firefly Lane became a runaway bestseller in 2009 and is considered a touchstone novel that brought women together. The Nightingale was voted a best book of the year by Amazon, Buzzfeed, iTunes, Library Journal, Paste, The Wall Street Journal and The Week in 2015. Additionally, the novel won the coveted Goodreads and People's Choice Awards. The audiobook of The Nightingale also won the Audiobook of the Year Award in the fiction category. Kristin is a former-lawyer-turned writer who lives in the Pacific Northwest with her husband.

Katrina spent fifteen years researching WWII, Poland and Auschwitz, writing the view of the Holocaust through Polish eyes.

#### Stephanie Sanchez, Mezzo-Soprano














Leonard Bernstein at 100



This year, Brandeis celebrates the centennial birthday of acclaimed American composer and conductor Leonard Bernstein, a Brandeis faculty member and a supporter of the University from its earliest days.

From 1951-56, Bernstein taught courses at Brandeis on modern music, opera and composition. He founded the university's Festival of the Creative Arts, which today honors his legacy as an artist, an educator, an activist and a humanitarian. Centennial events will include special concerts, classes and other campus wide activities during the Leonard Bernstein Festival of the Creative Arts, April 15-22, 2018.

Featured events include selections from Bernstein's opera Trouble in Tahiti performed by the Boston Lyric Opera; Late Night with Leonard Bernstein, a cabaret-style concert narrated by his daughter, Jamie Bernstein; and a concert version of Bernstein's Mass, performed by the Brandeis University Chorus and guest artists.
