How to protect these young people? One technique is a drive -by. Simply grab the electronic device and check it. You can also purchase parental monitoring software which will send an email to you listing every site and email from their devices. As a parent, grandparent or concerned adult, talk to your youngsters and ban all electronic devices in the bedroom and bathroom. Midwestern Region Members,

This is my last monthly article for the Vision and I thank you for taking your time to read my previous reports. It is my great pleasure to give you good news. Our region grew in membership in the last year. On July 1 of 2017 our region had 671 members and as of April, 2018 we had 794 members. We may even add more members before this coming July 1. We increased our clubs by 1 to 30 clubs. Gina Mullis is actively working on the chartering of a club in Evansville, Ind. If you know of anyone that lives in then Evansville area, please let me know and I will forward the information on to Gina. Active chartering effort is taking place in Cleveland, Ohio and possible efforts again in Cincinnati, Ohio. If you know of women in these areas please contact Barb Flory.



Clubs will be notified by SIA of the latest club numbers and the amount of dues that is expected to be sent to SIA for the existing members. Dues are due to SIA by (prior to) July 1, 2018. Paying dues on line is the most efficient and the easiest way to make changes. Please download your current club roster and check and double check that all information is correct including address and email. Remember to list new officers. If you know that you must terminate a member, this can be done at any time prior to the annual renewal of members.



If your dues are not paid by August 1, 2018, your club will be assessed a \$100.00 late fee. If you pay your dues after Sept 1, your late fee will be \$150.00. If club dues are not paid by Oct. 1, 2018 the club will be asked to forfeit their charter.

If you need any help negotiating the SIA web site, please call SIA at 1-215-893-9000. The website search portion has been "down" for a few months and is expected to be up and running soon.

The next membership campaign is called the "Diamond Campaign", Phase 1 Goals:

Less than 1% or better net change in membership (we want to minimize terminated members. Keep retention at 100% if at all possible and always add members.)



Make a club goal to increase your membership by more than 13%. For example if you have 15 members on your roster then make a goal of increasing your membership to 15 or more.

Make a club goal to avoid decreasing your membership by less than 14%. For example if you have 15 members on your roster then make a goal of avoiding decreasing your membership by 2.1 members. I know death and job transfers are inevitable. This situation will give our clubs a loss which must be compensated for by increased growth.

During your planning sessions this spring and summer, incorporate membership efforts into your year long plan of action. Membership is not a one shot deal but an ongoing month after month year after year effort. Pens for club growth. During this past year, I have sent to clubs a ballpoint pen for each new member added and for each recruiting member. I gave out many pens at our Conference in Lisle. If you did not notify me and did not receive your pens please contact me at franlot:really.com and I let me know how many pens your need. I will honor all requests for the club year of 2017 – 2018. I really do want to mail to you your deserved pens. If you have collected dues for a new members and send new member information and dues to SIA prior to the July 1 dues deadline, you also deserve pens so let me know even if you do so after July 1.



Good Luck for the next biennium and continue to grow our member numbers and clubs. It has been my pleasure to serve you and I hope to see you in Columbus, OH for the next Midwestern Region Conference April 26-28, 2019.

Several years, ago while sending off a care package to her Grandson stationed overseas, our member Marilyn Akers thought it would be a great project to start sending packages to female soldiers. She investigated and found a website, anysoldier.com where you can choose a military contact and send packages of needed and wanted items to a military unit stationed overseas. We have been doing this project for over eight years. Included in each box is a handwritten note of greetings and appreciation to our military personnel along with our Soroptimist brochure. We also include Beanie Babies. These small stuffed animals provide two purposes. First, they make nice packing materials. Second, they can be given to the children in the village or city where the troops are stationed. Previously, one unit sent us a thank you note with a picture of smiling children holding the Beanie Babies. The unit used the stuffed animals to help build a relationship with the local children. We know that these packages bring some comfort to our troops who are so far from home.



On April 9, 2018, the Soroptimist Club of Indianapolis Metro hosted a leadership dinner event called, "Presenting your Best self", for nearly 40 teen girls from greater Indianapolis area and nearby Dayton, Ohio. The event was held at the historical Indianapolis Propylaeum

hall, which is owned by the Indianapolis Propylaeum Historic Foundation, Inc., a 501(c)(3) organization whose mission is "To advance educational and cultural opportunities for women and the community and to maintain and preserve the historic Propylaeum."

The Propylaeum is one of those synergetic organizations with Soroptimist International, building its foundation from a local Indianapolis woman named Mary Wright Sewall, who in the early 1900's was an activist that campaigned for a woman's right to an education equal to that of men.

The 66 total attendees included club members, members of the Propylaeum, community mentors, teachers and parents. To start the evening, the girls and other guests were treated to a tour of the grounds and historical home that was originally a three-story residence to a local wealthy brewery owner and his family in the late 1800's.

In addition to a catered meal with a formal dinner setting, the teens received some basic etiquette tips from their adult mentors at each table.

Guest speakers included, Shaunesste Terrell, Domestic Violence/Sexual Assault Resource Prosecutor for the Indiana Prosecuting Attorney's Council and Kristen Martin, Deputy Prosecutor in Marion County, Indiana. The speakers shared their practical insights on social media and its impact on teens and adults with respect to safety and avoiding bad outcomes from those who prey on others.

This event was a follow up to the SI Indy Metro's Club, Dream It Be It Workshop in October 2017. We hope to continue to make connections to help the girls in our community and expose them to culture and other learning opportunities to build their confidence and awareness beyond their current circumstances.

The 23th Annual Celebration of Women was held on March 15th at the Monroe Golf and County Club with 130 in attendance. Our guest speaker (a former winner of one of our awards) was Mckenzie Kuehnlein who is a reporter for 13 ABC Action News. She is from Monroe and graduated from University of Toledo. Her presentation was very well received and she credited her award that she received in helping her finish her education. We gave out \$9,500 in awards that evening and to listen to the winners on how they were so appreciative in receiving them was truly heart warming. It made us feel that it was worth every effort put forth to raise the funds to give out these Education awards.. Of course, the Helen Applin Award (the reason why Celebration of Women event was created) is one of the highlights of the evening. When you learn what these women do in the community to improve the lives of others, you realize how fortunate Monroe is to have such women that volunteer their time and effort to make a difference.. This is an event that our club should be so proud to have created and hope that it will continue for another 23 years.
