

Buffalo Run Farm Summer Camp Guidelines

We are happy your camper will be joining us for camp this summer! Our goal is to provide a healthy, safe, and fun environment for all campers. Doing so this year will require several new policies and procedures.

Like you, we are closely monitoring the changing conditions related to the Covid-19 pandemic and will continue to do so to ensure that we are following the latest recommendations from **the CDC and the Pennsylvania Department of Health**. *Based on the latest information, below are the procedures we will implement when Summer Camp begins on June 22nd.*

Depending on the logistics of the summer camp, Buffalo Run Farm may require additional safety practices beyond these precautions.

1. Drop Off/Pick Up: Instructors will greet each camper at their cars each morning. Parents and siblings should stay in their car. Parents/Guardians will be asked a set of health questions at each drop off including ensuring camper temperatures do not exceed 100.4 degrees. *Campers and staff must check temperatures before arriving at camp each day. Anyone with a 100.4 degree or higher temperature may not enter the clubhouse.* Pick ups will be handled in a similar matter with instructors facilitating students meeting their families at their cars. Parents and all other siblings should stay in their cars.

2. Hygiene: All campers must wash hands upon entering the clubhouse and before leaving. Regular hand-washing breaks will be scheduled during camp. In addition, hand sanitizer stations will be strategically placed throughout the farm. All instructors and other staff must wear masks while inside the clubhouse. Campers are strongly encouraged to wear masks but may choose not to if health, emotional, or sensory issues do not allow.

Campers must bring their own water bottle and are not permitted to share with other campers.

3. Physical distancing: Campers will be seated/stationed in a way that allows for social distancing at all times. 6' distance is optimal. Campers will be divided into small groups in order to allow for minimal contact with others. Please explain to your camper before, coming to the farm, importance of social distancing and we will remind each camper at our daily camp meetings by incorporating a fun game with pool noodles.

4. Cleaning: All camp equipment will be thoroughly sanitized at the close of camp each day.

5. Supplies/Tools: All campers will have their own provided marked, grooming tools for the duration of the camp. If common tools must be used, tools must be sanitized between each use or handled with provided gloves.

6. Ventilation: When possible, doors and windows of the clubhouse will be open to allow for ventilation. Most of our campers time will be spent outdoors.

7. Group Size: No more than 20 persons will occupy the clubhouse at once.
