I would like to invite you to join me that evening at a table reserved especially for juniors and Miss Poppies. In addition, I am including information on The CHILDREN OF WARRIORS NATIONAL PRESIDENT'S PATCH. It would be nice if we could award this patch to you while she is here.

CHILDREN OF WARRIORS NATIONAL PRESIDENTS' PATCH The National Presidents' Scholarship provides scholarships to deserving children of our nation's veterans and servicemembers who have sacrificed greatly due to their parents' dedication to defending America and our values.

A special Junior patch has been created for our Junior members and SAL youth to be involved in raising money for the National Presidents' Scholarship Fund. Help get the word out to all our members! We hope every Junior and SAL youth will be involved in some activity to raise money for scholarships, which are funded by the Educating Children of Warriors Fund. Most Juniors and SAL youth will become eligible for this scholarship, so they may be personally impacted by their fundraising efforts.

Any Junior or SAL youth can earn this patch if they raise at least \$5 for each year old. For example, a 17-year-old would raise a minimum of \$85 (17 x \$5 = \$85.)

Donations can be raised a variety of ways. Juniors and SAL youth can solicit donations from family, friends, Legion Family members or contribute themselves. Fundraising activities can be coordinated, such as bake sales or other sales, etc. Funds can be raised individually or as a group, but each Junior or SAL youth receiving this patch needs to have raised the required minimum funds for their age. The goal is for the youth of our organization to be involved and aware of the scholarship project. HAPPY NEW YEAR!!!!!! Hope everyone enjoyed their holidays!!!!!

First and foremost thank you to the Units that sent in their Mid-Year Reports in a timely manner. Three of which, their Chairmen had health issues or injuries and they made sure their reports were sent in. OUT OF 80 Units, I only received 10 Mid-Year Reports. I am going to stress that it is absolutely imperative that these reports are turned in. National needs to know about the work the Units are doing to report to Congress. We are wanting legislation to be passed to help our veterans but in turn, we need to report on how we are promoting the program and how we are getting the word out to members and the public. Enough for my rant.

On November 26th, Michael Bloomberg filed to qualify for Arizona's presidential primary with the Arizona Secretary of State's Office.

On December 2nd, Senator Elizabeth Warren held a town hall meeting in Iowa City, Iowa.

On December 12th, the House of Representatives unanimously approved to extend the Older Americans Act, but still needs to be passed by the Senate. This Act provides funds to states to help about 11 million persons 60-plus each year.

On December 13th, the House Judiciary Committee voted on two articles of impeachment against President Trump. It will now go to the House to be voted on, then to the Senate. The House is planning to adjourn before Christmas.

Remember to write or call your members of Congress and ask them to vote for lower prescription drug costs. HR 3, Lower Drug Costs Now Act.



eUnits

Electronic units (eUnits) allow members to communicate and conduct meetings via teleconferencing, email, and in virtual groups. There is no difference in how an eUnit would charter or operate, except for how they choose to meet. Starting an eUnit involves the same procedure for a traditional unit with one exception: Check your state's law on voting electronically. In addition to electronic communication, eUnit members may meet in person as required by their unit constitution and bylaws.

Some traditional brick-and-mortar American Legion Auxiliary units may choose to utilize an eUnit/hybrid meeting structure in which members sometimes meet in person and sometimes online. Or, the in-person meetings are held in a physical location, but some members Skype or FaceTime into the meeting, or votes are taken outside of the in-person meetings via an emailed poll.

Examples of virtual meeting platforms might be via email to allow members to vote by using a site like Doodle, or members remoting in live FaceTime or Skype types of apps, or conducting meetings via online platforms like Google Hangouts.
