General Program Information

About the Youth of the Year Program

The Youth of the Year Award is a \$3,000 scholarship that aims to celebrate and support an outstanding student who has demonstrated exceptional leadership, academic achievement, and community involvement.

The Youth of the Year honoree is proven to be a well- rounded individual who is not only a good student but also involved. Aside from earning points for non-weighted GPA, points are given for participation in school and community organizations.

The winner selected at the local level will advance to the district competition, with the opportunity to compete nationally for a \$15,000 scholarship!

Eligibility Requirements

Applications must be submitted via email to scholarships@haverhillexchangeclub.com no later than **FRIDAY, MARCH 20, 2026.**

Candidates must be a resident of Haverhill, MA **OR** attend one of the following schools: ***Haverhill High School, Whittier Regional Vocational Technical High School, Pentucket Regional High School, or Bradford Christian Academy.***

Candidates must also demonstrate **leadership** in school or community activities, in addition to significant involvement in **community service** or **extracurricular activities**.

Candidates must be in their senior year of high school, eligible to graduate **this year**, and have plans to attend a college, university, certification/training program, or earn continuing education credits to further their education.

Instructions for Submitting an Application

Section 1: Contact Information

Section 1A & 1B: Activities & Community Service

All points should be based on a five-semester period beginning with sophomore year and ending with the close of the first semester of senior year. Be sure to get a score for each semester in each appropriate activity column, as well as total.

Please note that points in Sections 1A and 1B are given only for the highest level of achievement per semester. For example, the Captain or Co-Captain of an athletic team receives 2 points per semester. You do NOT receive an additional point for being a team member.

Section 2: Grades

Enter your GPA based on a non-weighted 4.0 scale. In addition, **please submit a copy of your transcript** with your application.

Section 3: Personal Achievements/Awards

List your top 10 achievements/awards including a short essay highlighting your most outstanding achievement. *Awards and the essay can be completed in the space provided or attached separately.*

Section 4: Essay

Section 4: Essay

Each student is responsible for preparing an essay on a subject selected by The National Exchange Club. The essay must be 800–1,200 words maximum. Although grammatical correctness and proper use of accepted rules of composition will be considered, points will be awarded primarily based on the overall impact of the essay. Therefore, logical and clear development, as well as persuasiveness, are most important. The purpose of the essay is to provide the judges with deeper insight into the character and beliefs of the nominee, and the nominee’s ability to clearly communicate with the reader. Based on these impressions, judges may award the essay up to 300 points.
