Perhaps **THIS** is the primary purpose for the existence of Right Hand Ministries: fulfilling our Father’s own desire for “pure and undefiled religion”, caring for the broken and uncared for in this world. We didn’t set out to do ministry only in India, but so far (since RHM got started around 2000) that’s how it’s been. Seeing that more than 15% of the world’s population is in India, and perhaps a higher percentage of the world’s injustice and poverty, there’s really no practical need for RHM to get involved in another country unless we know for sure it’s His leading.

Plain and simple, we’re about helping the broken children, widows, elderly and handicapped with their physical needs; but even more importantly, using the social aspect to show them Christ and bring them closer to Him. **Pray for us!**

**Below:** A few of the needy women in Reddipalem. The older woman on the 2nd row (far left), and the 2 young women on the left side of the front row, are all unable to walk. Girl in the pink (front row) cannot use her hands or legs and is mostly bedridden (she had a “brain fever” at 2 years old). Some in this village are mentally handicapped or having physical deformities, many stricken with polio as small children. The govt. allotted land in Reddipalem for handicapped people, but hasn’t provide much more. The pastor we work with is overseeing 15 there in our Manna Program, and feeds more than 20 others from his own ministry funds (RHM gives a small amount also). Some of them are finding hope in JESUS and His salvation. **Pray** the Lord will enable us to do more to help them.



## MANNA PROGRAM PROFILES

**NALINI NAYAK** tells the story that her husband, Fidem Nayak (a pastor), along with 2 of his ministry friends had gone to attend a fasting & prayer meeting in August 2008. A persecution of believers had started in their district, and a mob of Hindus went to the prayer meeting and stopped it. So this pastor and his 2 friends planned to go back to their home, but there was a bus strike and no communication. They started to walk in the jungle area (perhaps to avoid any possible conflicts). All through the night they walked in the jungle, and in the early morning they came near to a village. There another mob was having a secret meeting, planning to kill Christians. The mob saw the pastor and caught him with his friends, and then killed them with swords (not sure what kind of “swords”). Now Nalini is staying with her daughter. Her daughter is doing labor work to support them.



**SUBULUMMA** (Reddipalem Manna Program): At least 70 yrs old, her husband dying around 1995. She had 3 sons and 1 girl, but all 3 of her sons died (maybe due to alcoholism, a major problem in India). Her daughter married and is living elsewhere. She broke her leg twice around 2000. That, coupled with weakness from her old age, makes it impossible for her to go for work. She’s from a Hindu background, and just within the last few years has come to Christ through the local pastor, Prabhakar Rao, who is overseeing the Manna Program in Reddipalem. Her hut was one of about 70 that was burned down in a fire in 2016. She now stays in a temporary dwelling (photo above), waiting for the government to fulfill their promise to build permanent homes.

**CHILDREN'S PROFILES**

**BALINI** (13 years old, Morning Star Girls Home): Her father is alive, but the mother has died. When she was a small child, twice she had accidents, both times being near death. Both times one of her parents wanted to let her die (a family with 5 girls, considered a burden to many in the India culture). Her grandmother took responsibility, and she lived. Brother Diwakar of the Morning Star tried to convince them to let Balini come live with him. When the MS girls home was started in 2012, her father was willing to send her there.



**SRAVANTHI** (11 years old, HOPE): She came into HOPE at 5 years old. Her father was a heavy drinker, sometimes beating the kids and mother. The mother was doing field-work for money, the father not caring for them properly. She then sent her 3 children to their grandparents to get them away from the father's influence and abuse. She learned about HOPE and asked us to take Sravanthi in, which we did in 2010. She didn't even cry when her mother left her at HOPE. Now in the 4th grade.

**Praise the Lord** for a great response to our "LAST Appeal" update which was made via e-mail recently, asking potential donors to pray about giving toward a new HOPE Boys Home. So far \$16,000 has come in, which could be enough, but having much experience with bad estimates, probably not. By the time you receive this, we should be starting with construction.
