The noise at the show seemed lower than usual. Silencers/suppressors were abundant. Attendance, perhaps even exhibitors, seemed a bit lower than previously. This was the year of the suppressor. The Henry booth had several models with suppressors mounted, in .357 magnum, 9mm, .22, and .45-70. A suppressor and a lever gun in .357 magnum is a nice combination. For traditionalists, remember President Theodore Roosevelt liked suppressors and had them on a couple of his lever guns.


By my estimate, almost half the firearms on the line at Industry Day at the Range were equipped with suppressors. There were many other items of interest. With the elimination of the \$200 tax on silencers/suppressors, it is difficult to know how the market for silencers/suppressors will develop. The demand will likely increase immediately. Producers will probably manufacture silencers/suppressors as fast as they can for a considerable period of time. When costs are lowered, demand will increase. Increased demand will bring in more competition. It seems likely that more production of inexpensive silencers will enter the market. The \$200 tax has favored the high end. The overall number of legal silencers in the United States will increase exponentially. Prediction: silencers will be removed from the National Firearms Act. Exactly when is unknown.

[Secretary of the Interior Issues Order Expanding Hunting Access Nationwide](#)

Secretary of the Interior Doug Burgum has issued Secretarial Order 3447 – Expanding Hunting and Fishing Access, Removing Unnecessary Barriers, and Ensuring Consistency Across the Department of Interior Lands and Waters.

This sets a department wide policy that “public and federally managed lands should be open to hunting and fishing unless a specific, documented, and legally supported exception applies.”

This order directs the US Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Land Management, National Park Service, Bureau of Reclamation, and Bureau of Indian Affairs to identify and remove unnecessary regulatory barriers and allow access to hunting and fishing wherever practical.

This “open-unless-closed” policy will better align hunting and fishing policies on federally managed lands with adjacent State, Tribal, and Territorial wildlife agencies with the aim to remove access barriers, duplicative permits, and misaligned methods of take. This will provide additional opportunities and greater clarity for hunters and anglers using our federally owned lands.

Democrats in "The Land of Enchantment" are moving forward with a package of new laws to prohibit many common semi-auto firearms, along with other restrictions.

New Mexico SB 17, named the "Stop Illegal Gun Trade Act," is an omnibus gun ban. It passed the Democrat-controlled state Senate on Feb. 7 in a 21-17 vote along rough party lines. It now moves over to the House – which is controlled 44-26 by the Dems – for further consideration.

Among its tenets is a ban on the sale of "Extremely Dangerous Weapons," including .50-caliber rifles and their ammunition, machine guns, magazines that can hold more than 10 cartridges, and gas-operated firearms that can accept detachable mags or have a fixed magazine with a capacity of over 10 rounds.

The definition of "gas-operated firearm" included in the text of the bill would include any semi-automatic firearm that "harnesses or traps a portion of the high-pressure gas from a fired cartridge to cycle the action," using long-stroke pistons (such as AKs and M1As), short-stroke pistons (AR-18s, CZ Brens, FN FAL, FN SCAR, HK416, M1 Carbine, Mini-14/30), an impingement system (ARs), a blowback action (.380s and most AR-9s), or a hybrid system.
