

Who designs your equipment and outfits?

We all work on it, Jimmy, Wally and myself. Then we turn it over to Wally, he builds all the stuff we work with.

Do you have to do anything special to Psych yourselves up for a Buffett Concert?

None, we just suit up and head for the Parking L.

Nope, we just suit up and head for the Parking Lot. The Parrot Heads psych us up!

I got to ask this. How many times have you been Flashed?

(After laughing) Never. (I don't believe this one, do you?)

What do you do during the concert itself?

We're involved with a lot of the special effects, and this year there was "El Stumpo".

Can you rate your top Venues (in no particular order)?

Irvine! That parking lot is the craziest.

Pine Knob is turning into a great show, and Cincy,
